Our local foodbank is 10 years old. It was set up in 2010 to meet the needs of local families during a crisis when they were unable to

afford to buy food for themselves. Since then the needs have very much continued and our work has drastically increased. In our first full year (2011) we gave out 81 food parcels. In 2015 it was 159 parcels and by 2019 this had grown to over 400!

We are very grateful to the many churches, businesses, schools and individuals in the local community who donate food and money, either regularly or as a one-off gift. We have no other income so we really couldn't do it without them!



We are run by the local church but greatly supported by the whole community, and we depend entirely upon volunteers to provide short

term help to assist people through a difficult or crisis period, whilst working alongside professionals who can help with finding long term financial and social support. Food donations can be dropped off at the collection points in Sainsbury's & Waitrose, The Kings Centre in Wantage and Cornerstone in Grove.

A huge thank you to our many supporters who enable the Foodbank to continue providing much needed help to people in our local community.

Obituary Ron Watkins 1933 - 2021

Ron was born in 1933 and raised at King's Farmhouse East Hanney with his brothers Brian & David and sister Kath. He remained in the village for all of his 87 years. His early years saw him helping on the farm managed by his father and working as a gardener for Lord Ebury at Philberds Manor.

Food was scarce in those war torn years and Ron did his bit by supplying the villagers with rabbits. His ferrets earnt him some good money - all with the local landowner's permission of course!

At the tender age of 18 Ron was conscripted to join the U.N. Forces in the Korean War. Originally in the Berks & Bucks Regiment he then joined the Durham Light Infantry where he served in Germany, Egypt and Korea. Fighting against the communist North Koreans & Chinese, Ron fought in unimaginable weather conditions and lost many comrades.

Returning to Hanney, Ron started courting his late wife Hazel and they were married in 1957 at East Hanney Church. Together they lived happily at Cross Tree House, Mill Cottage and Brookside and had 4 children over that period – Glenda, Glyn, Ann-Marie & Kerry. Their final house was Orchard View Main Street, built in the orchard of

Hazel's late parent's cottage – Sunnybank. Here Ron fulfilled his lifetime ambition of rearing and racing grevhounds. Often seen walking on the village lanes and fields with a pair of eager young dogs, Ron achieved his ultimate aim of winning a 'Classic' in 2020. Reared in his garden with the help of his Grandson Jamie, Kingsbrook Glyn won the prestigious Summer Stavers Classic. Ron was a keen gardener and up until recently he and his recently departed twin brother Brian both held allotments - competition for the best potatoes was fierce! He often gave out gardening advice and if vou needed to know anything about Hanney history, Ron was the person to speak to. Forthright in his opinions, you always knew where you were with Ron. Ron was a great family man and loved spending time with his 10 grandchildren and 3 great granddaughters. He was a Hanney man through and through and witnessed many changes over his 87 years never opposed to progress providing it was in keeping with the village. The family would like to thank everyone for all their kind words of support. Ron

will be greatly missed by all.

Here's a snap from, I'm guessing, the late 1920s or early 1930s of the A338, looking north from the junction in East Hanney opposite La Fontana. The building on the left is what was the Crown pub until it became a private house and I think the gable end directly above the car behind the wall is the house called Poundcroft.

The car is, I'm assured, a flat-nose Morris Cowley - not to be confused with the bullnosed! - from the mid / late 1920s and was registered in Middlesex. It's parked with no one in it. Perhaps the driver and passengers are visiting the folk who live in the cottage? Looking at the trees, it's obviously winter, and the long shadows suggests the sun was low in the sky in the west, so midafternoon, probably about 3.20pm. (I'm joking about the time!) Note the little dog, nestling against the low wall and railings, bottom right in the pic. He's waiting for the host and visitors to finish their tea, in the hope that he may get given the leftover cucumber and fish-paste sandwiches.

I recently listened to a radio programme discussing the topic of self-care, the concept of looking after ourselves. It commented on the vast array of self-care products available for consumers to purchase and



about how we care for others, is an expectation that we are caring for ourselves, that our self-care is the high-water mark to compare our support for others against. I feel that those contributing OF ENGLAND to the radio discussion on self-

the negative, selfish and individualistic undercurrents that a focus on self-care can create.

It reminded me of Jesus' command to "love our neighbour as ourselves" (Mark 12:31) and "to treat others, how you want to be treated" (Matthew 7:12). These verses express an understanding that our relationship to others should not just be defined as "I" and "them" but in terms of "we". If we treat each other with the same level of care that we would like or feel that we desire, then everyone would be supporting and supportive of each other. How I am doing is interconnected with how you are doing, as we have a God-given responsibility to look after each other. Jesus goes on to say that we should love others "just as I have loved you" (John 15:12), referring to his willingness to give of himself for others, seen in his death on the cross, which, with his rising again, we celebrate at Easter.

True love is not desperately wanting someone else.

True love is being willing to do whatever is best for another.

During this ongoing pandemic and throughout the national lockdowns, we have seen people going the extra mile to help, support, care and provide for others. Many have shaped their lives around those they care for. We have literally seen people lovingly helping their neighbours.

Does this mean that we should all ditch the idea of self-care and just keep doing things for others?

Well, no!

Tucked into the verses that Jesus said

care were missing certain important aspects of self-care. All of us are valuable. The reason why we care for others is the same reason why we should care for ourselves; we are all unique, special and made in God's image.

Another reason why self-care is important, is that if we don't look after ourselves then we won't be in the best place to care for others and do all that we need to do. We need to look after ourselves, so that we can look after those around us. Running ourselves into the ground will always have a negative impact on others; from the stress it puts on our closest relationship to the grumpiness that we can pass on to the people we encounter.

If I am in a good place and appropriately caring for myself, then I am more productive, more efficient, more resilient, more sympathetic and more supportive of others. There is always the concern that self-care can develop into or mask selfishness. But this is a reality to be aware of, not a reason to avoid responsibly investing in ourselves.

It is not an "either/or" between self-care or caring for others, its "both/and". We need to be aware of how we are treating others and the opportunities that we have to support them, alongside keeping an eye on how we are doing and putting in time to rest and recharge ourselves.

What opportunities might we have this week to care for and support others? What ways may we need to practise selfcare this month?

The Letcombe Brook Project

We are truly blessed with many natural assets in our area, and one of the finest is the Letcombe Brook. It's not just any old brook...oh no!....and it is looked after by the 'Letcombe Brook Project'.

Much loved by local folk, it's a chalk stream that runs from Letcombe Regis to East Hanney, and is home to much wildlife, including some protected species.

It's a 'Chalk stream' - they're rare - so the Letcombe Brook Project was set up in April 2003 to protect the natural beauty of the brook.

The Project's website - well worth checking out - www.letcombebrook.org.uk - contains, amongst much else, their 2020 End of Year Report. In it, you can read about the thriving wildlife in and around the brook, including otters, water voles, water shrews, bats, kingfishers, little egrets, grey and yellow wagtails, spotted flycatchers, grass snakes and common lizards! Brown trout, sticklebacks, minnows and many other varieties of fish swim in the brook, whilst dragonflies and damselflies fly above. The Brook is also an important feeding corridor for several bat species. For a city boy like me I was surprised to learn that mink however, aren't very welcome visitors; apparently they eat other varieties of little creatures.

Himalayan Balsam is another unwelcome visitor to the brook and our very own flood group have been clearing it from our stretch of the brook with a good deal of success...well done them! Big ups too to East Hanney Parish Council who make an annual contribution of £800 to the Project which relies on volunteers and working parties. 2020 has been a difficult year for them.

Once some semblance of 'normality' is re-



sumed, the organisers intend to return to the usual range of volunteering activities. In the meantime, the brook makes a great place to take your exercise walk, and whilst you're partaking of your perambulation, keep an eye out for wildlife and let the folks at the Project know if you see anything exciting. You can contact them on their Facebook page or by email: <u>info@letcombebrook.org.uk</u>, or by phone -07737 639253

You can also report your wildlife sightings along the Brook using the iRecord app – its free to download to your smartphone and easy to use.

If you spot a potential problem or something that concerns you such as dead fish or an obstruction in the brook that could cause a flood risk, please let the Project folk know, and if you would like to help with some litter picking during your exercise walks, they can provide you with some equipment.

Mark Bradfield, head hombre at the Project, finishes his report by saying...

"You can be sure we are still working as hard as we can to look after our fabulous chalkstream. Keep in touch, be safe and enjoy the fabulous community green space provided along the brook!" Well said Mark, keep up the good work!
