





Love the sound of our church bells? Then stick around West Hanney on Friday 5th Nov, when a visiting 'Bellringing team' will attempt a 'full peal' from about 10am at St. James the Great.

A full peal means that at least 5,040 changes in the sequence of the bells has to be achieved. Each ringer of the six bells has to remember this sequence and no help or guidance is allowed.

It takes a minimum 3 hours of nonstop



tenor bell at St. James weighs over 18 cwt.) and mental challenge, as concentration has to be maintained for a long period.

The leading ringer of this

attempt is Colin Turner, who became the first bellringer to ring 5,000 peals, and has now reached 7,760! What an unbelievable achievement.

WHPC would like to apply for the roads

WHPC would like to apply for the roads around the West Haney Green

(Buttercross) to be recognised as a public right of way and a public highway and thus maintained at public expense. It would appear that these roads currently are not owned by anyone, and they are not recorded on the Highway Record Map that Oxford County Council took over from Berkshire County Council in the local government reorganisation in the 1970's. WHPC are seeking evidence through witness statements, historic photographs or other evidence that these roads were in use as a public highway prior to the 1st of December 1930 or during the period 2nd May 2001 and 2nd May 2006. Similarly, WHPC would like to apply for the path on the south side of School Road to be recog-

THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND

Listening is important. It can make a great difference when we give people time and space to talk. I have valued the times when others have truly listened to me. But how often do we actually, listen?

The New Testament challenges us to "be quick to listen, slow to speak" (James 1:19). Listening can be transformative, allowing people to process their experiences and emotions, but it is also draining and time consuming. It is an activity that we must choose to do and a skill that we can develop.

At this time of year, we have had and will have the opportunity to reflect on black history, the sacrifices of those who have fought in wars and give time to remember our loved ones who have died. It can be challenging hearing stories that are traumatic and different from our own experiences. But it is important that we take time to pause and listen to others, as giving space to hear different voices shows that we value individuals, allows us to fully understand the climate that we are living in and helps us to make better informed decisions about the actions that we take. But we also live in a culture which is increasingly becoming more polarised around political, moral, social and spiritual issues, impacted by issues of fake news, cancel culture and echo chambers.

Listening is at its hardest when we hear things that we don't agree with. If we ignore the views and realities of others, then divisions only deepen and in one form or another, people get hurt. One of the most radical things that we can do is to listen to someone that we do not agree with.

We need to listen, so that we show respect to others, honouring God's command to love others

We need to listen, so that we are fully aware of the situation that we are in, hearing the voices of others.

We need to listen, so that we can effectively respond to or challenge what others have said.

We need to listen, so that we can learn from past mistakes and learn more about current problems.

We need to listen, so that we can grow and develop.

I need to listen more and be slower to speak.
