## **Both East and West Hanney**

**Parish Councils** hosted a flood summit at The Memorial Hall chaired by our MP Olly Glover on 10th April.

The idea for the meeting came from the Flood Resilience Group and the tireless Tim Glass.

Clive Manvell of The Hanney Flood Group put together an impressively detailed presentation that focussed the minds of Thames Water, The EA, and representatives of both the County and District Councils. Also in attendance, and making up the 37 participants were Parish Councillors from many neighbouring villages.

The issues that have plagued areas of both villages were discussed at length and through the guidance of Olly, a joined up action plan involving all agencies is being formulated to relieve all these areas.

For years there has been a disconnect between each body but now there is a far better understanding of difficulties that in turn will lead to a longer term solution.

The meeting culminated in a village walkabout highlighting the pinch points in the village.

So many villagers contributed behind the scenes with hospitality, directing traffic hosting the walk and answering questions, it's difficult to thank all in the piece.

Thank you to everyone who suggested areas where oak bollards could be placed to protect the verges, all will be considered at the next PC meeting.

After meetings with Thames Water, they advised they will soon begin the remedial works to the lane by the school and the verges that were damaged when their tankers took short-cuts to the pumping station.

The planning appeal into the construction and operation of a solar farm on farmland to the East of Denchworth was heard by Mr. S Rennie, Planning Inspector on 11th March, with a site visit on 12th March. After carefully considering the reasons for the refusal of planning permission, and the points put forward in opposition to this proposal, the Planning Inspector concluded the benefits would outweigh the harms. The appeal was allowed, and planning permission was granted.

Renewable Connections Developments Limited have confirmed that the solar farm as proposed could produce an annual power output of over 33,000 MWh, which could power over 11,000 homes, and the renewable energy generated could make a contribution towards reducing net carbon dioxide emissions.

Detailed Planning Conditions have been agreed with Renewable Connections Developments Limited. West Hanney Parish Council and Denchworth Meeting will endeavour to ensure that these conditions are fully complied with.

Separate to the planning process and appeal, both parishes have agreed a Community Benefit Fund with Renewable Connections Development Limited to be paid over the operational life of the solar farm.

The next meeting is the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council to be held on Tuesday  $6^{\rm th}$  May 2025 at 7.30pm in the Olde Hanney Room, HWMH.

## Making sure that crime doesn't pay

I recently spent some time sifting through grant applications for my Community Fund.

Each year we provide around half a million pounds to good causes in Thames Valley by

taking money from criminals.

Some of the money comes through the courts, when judges can make orders under the Proceeds of Crime Act; and in cases where stolen goods are recovered but cannot be reunited with their rightful owner, they are sold and the money goes into this fund.

Any local group can apply, they don't need to be registered charities, but the money does need to go towards crime prevention in some way.

Amongst a wide range of applications received this year we've tried to focus on schemes to tackle anti-social behaviour and vehicle crime. This has included CCTV systems, knife crime prevention and support for victims of crime.

By law, we cannot put this money straight back into police budgets, so it is great to work with the community on crime reduction.

Preventing crime in the first place is, after all, better than catching criminals afterwards.

Locally some of the organisations that have benefitted included The Sinodun Players in Wallingford, with a project to reduce anti-social behaviour; Didcot Army Cadets; Be Free Young Carers; and Youth Challenge Oxfordshire. Sofea - the fantastic Didcot-based charity working with



young people - also received funding for their work across Thames Valley to support young people transitioning between primary and secondary school.

As well as the regular funding available to local groups the cash taken from criminals is also used to support other organisations.

I have set up ongoing funding arrangements with Neighbourhood Watch across Thames Valley to help support their crime prevention work.

We support Street Pastors, volunteers from local churches who give up their time to make sure that people can get home safely after a night out.

Recently Business Crime Reduction Partnerships have started to benefit from this money to help them in the fight against shoplifting and retail crime.

As well as supporting our counties' High Sheriffs in their charitable work, one of the most important partnerships that this money enables is with our volunteer search and rescue teams who do so much to help those missing and in distress The next round of funding will open in the summer.

Their efforts for the club are well known, and they deserve massive praise and thanks from the whole Community of Hanney and surrounding villages!

A couple of basic stats indicate just what they have achieved ... HYFC has grown from just 5 players in 2005 to over 320 today, with 17 teams and more than 40 coaching staff. Needless to say, it is the envy of many other clubs, offering as it does, some fantastic facilities and teams at every age group from 4 to seniors.

The youngsters who've played over the years, I'm sure will echo my thanks.... # THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND



May is my favourite month of the year - Spring turning into early summer - still cool and fresh, but everything around us bursting into new life. For those of us lucky enough to have gardens, it's a busy but rewarding time of year.

And it's a good time to realise how fortunate we are, living in a peaceful place. Now I am no killjoy – I believe we should appreciate and enjoy the good things around us, and be grateful. But that doesn't mean we should turn our backs on the needs of the rest of the world.

Traditionally in England, Christian Aid Week falls in May – a good time to show our gratitude for the good things we enjoy by giving a helping hand to others less fortunate.

There are misconceptions about Christian Aid. Emphatically it is not about aid for Christians. It is a charity set up by Churches Together in England to help the poorest and neediest people in the world, regardless of their faith, religion, nationality or culture.

As we have seen USAID closed down suddenly, without warning and with no transition arrangements, we are painfully aware that there are many people suffering and dying as a result.

And sadly our own government, hedged around with economic pressures and new threats in the world, has reluctantly, understandably but regrettably, made cuts to our British aid budget.

We can bewail all of this, but better, we can consider how far we can step up, and together as ordinary citizens, rally round where governments are no longer providing help.

Christian Aid helps in two ways. In disasters and emergencies they provide urgently needed relief, often as part of the Disasters Emergency Committee. But alongside this, most of their work is development, finding ways to help the poorest people to work themselves out of poverty, giving people the means to provide for their families by their own efforts.

Now it doesn't matter whether you support Christian Aid or Save the Children or Tear Fund or Comic Relief, or other similar charities doing similar work. And they all have websites which make it easy to make one off donations or set up standing orders. Christian Aid Week this year is 11th – 17th May. For me it's a trigger – a reminder to remember the poorest people in the world, whether we respond through Christian Aid or any other similar charity.

There are those in the world who think it's right to turn our backs on those in need. I believe we're better than that – and we can show that we still care.

And meanwhile, we can still enjoy the beauty of May!

#### £7.4 million road resurfacing programme to begin next month

Nearly 100 roads across Oxfordshire will be improved as part of a £7.4 million highway maintenance programme beginning this spring.

Oxfordshire County Council and its contractor will be visiting 73 towns and villages between 22 April - 16 June to carry out surface dressing work.

Over one million square metres of carriageway will be treated.

**Councillor Andrew Gant, Oxfordshire County Council's Cabinet Member for Transport Management, said:** "Prevention is better than cure, and this work builds on a similar programme of work, which we carried out last year.

"We realise how important the quality of our roads is to our residents and this work will help keep many miles of highways in a better condition for years to come. Surface dressing is one of the most cost effective methods of roads maintenance, with the spring and summer being the best time to complete the work.

"The council is urging motorists to watch out for notifications of the work taking place and to drive carefully after it has been carried out."

Driving too fast on a recently treated road can result in broken windscreens or chipped paintwork, as the friction from the tyres can dislodge loose chips. There is also an in-

creased risk of skidding while the new chippings 'bed in'.

For these reasons, an advisory speed limit of 20mph will be put in place. It is important to adhere to these low speeds until all warning signs have been removed.

"He was actually called Frank, was much loved and respected and had the kindest of hearts. He had the patience of a saint, he let all of the local kids help themselves to Mangels (Mangel-Wurzels - cow fodder) for Halloween .. not swedes .. and he also let them help milk cows, feed the calves, collect eggs. He allowed kids to take dead wood for bonfires from one of the copses on the farm. He also allowed them use the old disused pig stys to play in, and also take home lots of the apples and plums he grew behind Dandridge Mill and also on the farm.... oh not to mention the kittens, harvest time etc. etc..



Frank did this for a few generations of children - not just mine - he really was a good egg and in his youth one of the footballers that won the cup for Hanney. He was a true gent and Hanney Legend - Frank's kindness made growing up here a gift and true blessing."

Lovely words Debs, thank you, and as Debs mentions, Frank played in the 1946/47 Hanney Utd football team that won the North Berks Cup. See pic below. The team, with Frank, won it again the following year. They look a hard bunch don't they? None of this writhing around in fake agony like Liverpool and Arsenal players do these days! .....only joking all you Scousers and Gooners fans out there...I know every team does it, and it's pathetic and embarrassing to watch!!

I'm assured by a gent who witnessed their many successes, that before a game, the team would visit the Black Horse for a swift pint or two!

#### CHARNEY BASSETT MILL OPEN TO PUBLIC 10th and 11th MAY

As in previous years, Charney Bassett's very own Water Mill will be open to the public on National Mills Opening Weekend (10/11 May).

Its workings have been lovingly restored by the former Vale of White Horse Industrial Archaeology Group and if you haven't seen inside the building, it is well worth a visit.

The building will be open from 2.00 – 4.00 pm on both Saturday and Sunday afternoons. It is located on the opposite side of Lyford Road to St Peter's Church and directly opposite the entrance to Charney Manor. For Sat Nav users the postcode is OX12 0EN (the Mill building is attached to Mill Cottage).

The building (Grade 2 listed) is owned by Oxfordshire County Council and leased to the Parish Council on a 99-year repair and maintenance lease. Since the Industrial Archaeology Group was wound up, the Par-



ish Council has been looking for ways to make the building more available to the public and for anyone with an interest in the longer term future of the building who cannot get to view it on the opening weekend please contact the Parish Clerk (Trevor Brown) at

And here's another plus that's news to me... ....Rob Clarke from esure insurers explained how lower speeds lead to 'reduced collision risks, translating into lower insurance premiums for drivers'. This financial benefit – estimated by esure to be currently £45 per driver per year – is a strong incentive for the wider public to embrace 20mph limits.


