

This is the third year running that The Plough has won and the first time ever that a Pub has won the award three consecutive years running. Owain and Luke are seen with pub regulars receiving their Certificate from White Horse CAMRA Membership Secretary, Tarquin May. White Horse CAMRA Chairman, Simon Moore said 'The Plough has deservedly won the award for a third time. They serve 4 regularly changing real ales and they're always in tip-top condition. The pub serves great food and has a lovely atmosphere. Congratulations to Owain, Luke and the team at The Plough!"

allowed themselves a modest libation by way of celebration, news came through of another award they've earned, this from 'South England Prestige Awards' who voted them - not for the first time!! - 'Best Pub of the Year.'

The Black Horse now sells four real ales, which normally include Timothy Taylor's Landlord, Theakston's Best Bitter and two regularly changing ales.

Congratulations to Cllr Ron

Batstone for being elected our County Councillor representing the newly formed Division of Grove, which includes East Hanney, West Hanney and Denchworth. The Council looks forward to working closely with Ron on all matters affecting West Hanney residents.

A meeting was held with the Highways Engagement Officer to enlist her help in progressing a number of unresolved Highways issues, these include the recording and maintenance of the roads around West Hanney Green, and the

recognition and maintenance of the footway on the south side of School Road to St James Primary School as a Public Right of Way.

By the time you read this, contractors for Thames Water will have repaired the damage to our village green and roadside verges caused by the sewage tankers in February and are due to repair the damaged surface on the byway running from the school past the sewage pumping station.

The next meeting is on Wednesday 18th June at 7.30pm in the Olde Hanney Room, HWMH.

Well, some of us did...a total of 2,097 out of an electorate of 7,367, that's 28.5%, and the candidate we selected was Ron Batstone, a Liberal Democrat. He got 886 little ticks in

his box, some 42.3% of the vote, well ahead of the next candidate, Martin Freeman of

Reform, who got 554 votes..

Tories were next with 373. Labour and the Greens were very close to each other on 122 and 123 respectively.

The latter candidate was the aptly named 'Adam Swallow' ...good name for a Green person?.. Swallow? ...birdies and all that green stuff?!

Ron clearly hadn't heard the good news about his election success when this snap was taken. He does look rather glum doesn't he?

No matter, I'm sure when he realises what a lovely bunch we Hanney, Denchworth, Lyford and Charney folk are, he'll manage a big cheesy grin!

Meantime we offer him our big up congratsit would be great to see him sometime, maybe at a Parish Council Meeting or two? West Hanney Parish Council leader and the font of all knowledge David Corps advised me - for which my sincere gratitude - on a few 'Council' related matters....

County Councillor for the new

Cllr Sally Povolotsky remains our District Councillor for the ward of Steventon and the Hanneys.

Things will get more complicated in the future. The ward of Steventon and the Hanneys is due to change with West Hanney and Denchworth joining the ward of Grove North, leaving East Hanney and Steventon.

However, the Labour Government is pressing ahead with local government reorganisation that will see District Councils abolished and the County Council replaced with a Unitary Authority. What form it will take is still to be decided with three proposals being considered.....

An 'Oxfordshire Unitary Authority' akin to Oxfordshire County Council currently, a 'South Oxfordshire Unitary Authority' or a 'outh Oxfordshire and West Berkshire Unitary Authority'.

We can also look forward to electing a Combined Authority Mayor in due course, probably covering Oxfordshire, Buckinghamshire and Berkshire."

THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND



Recent headlines have been difficult to cope with.

Depressing stories of 'men behaving badly' (it's usually the men, I have to admit): autocratic leaders throwing their weight around; cruel conflicts that leave innocent people bereaved and homeless; war crimes that no one seems able to stop. Life seems to be getting harder for all of us, as we get poorer and sicker, instead of enjoying life the way we hoped it would be. Friends tell me that they have stopped listening to the news, because it is so overwhelming and hard to bear.

So it's not surprising to hear people say they can't believe the world was created by a good God. Surely a God who is supposed to be loving and powerful should be doing a better job? Is there a good answer to this challenge to the Christian faith? It really depends what we think the purpose of life is all about. Is the universe here just so we can be happy in our small corner? What kind of control do you expect God to exercise over the way people behave? We might like the idea of God sorting out the war in Ukraine or Israel, but we probably don't want God interfering with our own freedom to do what we like. Christians believe that God has given us all free will. We can choose how we will live. for good or ill. This is because freedom is the essential requirement for love. If we are compelled to love God or other people, it is not genuine love but forced obedience.

Giving us free will means taking an enormous risk that we will abuse it. We believe God took that risk in creating us and then had to pay the price for it in his own person –his Son Jesus got crucified.

Compare our world with life at school. In the classroom, under the beady eye of the teacher we behave ourselves (mostly) and pay attention. We get told what to do and we get on with it as instructed.

Outside in the playground, things are a bit different. We have a bit of freedom. There is less supervision and bad things can happen. Games develop and groups form. Some people get left out. There is teasing and bullying. The head teacher knows the stuff that happens outside of class time. Does she try and stop it all? Not necessarily. Because head teachers know that there are important things for us to learn during break - like how to cope with 'real life', when things are challenging and relationships get stressful.

Do we expect God to run the world as if he was the teacher in the classroom, keeping everyone in order with his eye upon them? Or is life more like the playground, where we have freedom to get away with things? He has chosen the path of freedom so that we can learn to love.

Our responsibilities online

Social media and the increased use of technology in our everyday lives have brought benefits that would have been unimaginable just a few generations ago, yet we all know that there are drawbacks. A lot of the debate about social media can leave us feeling rather



powerless. It's all about big tech giants and the need for governments to impose regulations and restrictions, but the reality is that social media only serves to amplify the trends that already exist in society - both good and bad.

We can all have a role to play, whether it is about keeping ourselves and our loved ones safe, or being conscious of what we are sharing ourselves.

There is a lot of useful information available for parents in particular - a good place to start is <u>internetmatters.org</u>, which provides practical advice for parents and teachers. What's always worth remembering is that in many ways the risks that exist today have always existed, they have just taken on a different form. The speed of social media and the fact that it brings the outside world into our most private spaces presents some new challenges, but the underlying issues remain the same.

Increasingly parents will be aware of the risk of online grooming, but few people realise the largest proportion of indecent images are shared by children with other children - often to those they consider themselves to be in a relationship with, and these images may then be shared on to other people. Our children need to learn, not just how to be safe from strangers, but the importance of normal, healthy relationships, and how to treat each other offline as well.

Parents are key to this. Of course all children are different, with varying levels of maturity and differing needs. There is an understandable worry of children being left behind if they don't have access to the latest tech. These can be difficult decisions but if we as parents cannot withstand the inevitable "peer pressure" then why would we expect our children not to follow the same path.

Keeping children safe online often makes us think about the darker, more sinister side of social media; but we should also think about how we engage with the more benign side of social media. The old adage, never say anything online you wouldn't say to someone's face, remains very true. Often the separation provided by a screen can make us forget that we are talking to, or about, real people - whether that's celebrities or someone in our own village.

Social media is great, I use it a lot, but we know it has it's down sides. There are things that big companies can do to protect children in particular, but it's unfashionable these days to talk about our own responsibility. We can all play our part in making our online and offline world a little better.

At the recent Joint Annual Meeting of our two Parish

Councils, the 'main man' of our Community Woodland, Paul Sayers gave us an update on this real Jewel in Hanney's Crown!

'The Woodland was planted in the 1990s by Nigel Eady of Church Farm under the EU Set-Aside scheme to take land out of cereal production because of a perceived surplus. It was gifted to West Hanney Parish

Council (WHPC) by his estate in 2012. The adjoining Church Farm Meadow came to WHPC in 2017 as part of a 'Section 106' agreement with Sweetcroft, the developers of St James Way.

Both were skilfully negotiated for us by Chris Surman, then Chairman of WHPC.

The Woodland covers 27 acres (11 ha) with 1.6 miles (2.6 km) of rides. The Meadow covers 7 acres (3ha).

Maintenance: We aim to hold regular monthly working parties throughout the autumn and winter, these mainly concentrate on cutting back scrub encroaching onto the rides and also swamping the areas which have been kept clear for wild flowers.

Des Thomas has continued to cut the rides for us when ground conditions permit.

There is little problem with litter but any which does appear, usually bottles or cans, is quickly picked up either by me or by other dog walkers.

Wildlife: Despite the wet winter, the orchids did reasonably well last year, it will be interesting to see how they fare after a second very wet winter. The cowslips are doing well this spring and those which my wife Kay grew from seed gathered in the Woodland are now well established and spreading.



There are now 42 nest boxes. Of which 32 contained bird nests or nesting material with a further 3 containing mouse nests. One of those with a bird nest also contained at least twenty snails! Deer are sometimes seen in the woodland, mainly muntjac but sometimes roe. Also rabbits in the drier parts and occasionally a fox.

Church Farm Meadow: Alan Cottrell kindly cut the meadow for us again. This is essential maintenance.

The trees along the northern edge are now well established and the only maintenance they will require this year is to loosen the tree ties to allow the trunks to expand.

Acknowledgements: I would like to thank all the volunteers who turn out for the working parties, Des Thomas for mowing the Woodland rides and Alan Cottrell for cutting the meadow.

month - is on display in the Museum.

The skeleton below is that of the young lady who was the proud wearer of the brooch.

Several examples of this style of Anglo Saxon period brooch have been found....this one in Kent was described by those who know all the technical terms as "MIND-BLOWINGLY GOR-

GEOUS! 500-600 AD - Early Anglo-Saxon era silver-gilt plated disc brooch. It contains a nielloed border and gold appliqué with cloisonné garnet and glass cross, five shell bosses and filigree. Excavated in Kent."
