Three proposals are being considered for Oxfordshire, one of which would see the council areas of Vale of White Horse and South Oxfordshire join West Berkshire to become a new unitary authority. There is more information at:

THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND

NEWS FROM ST JAMES CHURCH. Some say patience will always be rewarded. Maybe at long last that patience (and much fund-raising) is about to be rewarded – we are hopeful that a contract with our contractors, will be signed to start major works in St James Church – not only to provide a loo, but also better catering facilities, a new room available for both church use and other community activities plus other minor improvements.

We hope to start the works over the next few weeks and be finished before Christmas (2025 I hasten to add!).

It will mean some changes to access to the church and our services over the next few weeks, but we will do our best to make it work to the best of our abilities.

SO WHY DOES THE FRONT CHURCH-YARD LOOK DIFFERENT NOW? There are very few places that are unlikely to have been cultivated for 1000 years – but our churchyard (like others all over the country) is one of them. So what! you might say – but this means it is rich in wildflowers and

grasses which are the food for birds and insects which in turn attract for food as well as shelter many small mammals.

This year we believe there about twice the number of species growing, by July they will set their seeds ready to flower and multiply as the years go by. When that happens the 'wilded' areas will have their first mow of the year, leaving behind a few 'out of the way' areas where the mammals are making their homes.

Our practice of mowing access paths through the wilded area will continue throughout the year and as always, the 'new churchyard' is regularly maintained.

Some minor works will be taking place over the next few weeks to increase the burial area available for the coming years.

Our food and well-being are totally reliant on a balanced eco-system and the policy by the wider church is proud to support this.

On my travels down the delightful highways

and byways of Hanney, I often hear comments regarding the current state of our churchyard.

Reader Sir Chris of Jay and Wisdom - has recently sent me an article that appeared in the Daily Telegraph, suggesting that an eco-friendly way of maintaining a churchyard was to use a herd of hungry goats who will chew their way through brambles, weeds, and excess foliage. This of course is claimed to be a natural and chemical-free way of clearing areas.

Locals have been asked not to approach the goats, to supervise children and keep dogs on leads. 'Biogoats 2 **Rent**' are the company that hire out the goats and a spokesman said: "We are an eco-friendly weed and brush control company. We hire goats out to the private, business, and agricultural sectors. Once seeds have passed through a goat, they are generally non-viable. The goats are very friendly and sociable animals, so you might also make yourself a friend or two." The company also claim that Jeremy Clarkson had stolen the idea for his

'Clarkson Farm' TV show.

More than just flytipping

Fly-tipping is more than an unsightly mess, it can be big business for criminals. From rogue traders claiming to be properly licensed, to large scale organised criminal gangs who will use threats and intimidation to illegally dump hundreds of tonnes of waste and the impact on victims and the environment can be huge.



In the last year alone there have been more than 100,000 incidents of fly-tipping across the South East and it is estimated that the cost to the economy in England is nearly a billion pounds.

Responsibility for waste dumping falls across several agencies. Local authorities are responsible for investigating, clearing and taking appropriate enforcement action in relation to small scale fly-tipping on public land. The Environment Agency is responsible for dealing with large-scale fly-tipping (more than a lorry load), hazardous waste and fly-tipping by organised gangs. Too often responsibility can be passed from one organisation to another.

So I have joined forces with Police & Crime Commissioners in Hampshire, Surrey, Sussex and Kent in an attempt to get police forces, specialist police units, the Environment Agency and councils to work together to tackle the problem. We held our first meeting in Kent in early June. Many people don't realise that often criminals who are involved in waste crime will also be responsible for vehicle thefts, money laundering, drug trafficking and a wide range of other offences.

Victims are often hit twice. Not only will rural and industrial businesses be impacted by having waste dumped illegally on their land or in their buildings, but they often have to pay for the cost of the clean up - or face stiff fines themselves! This needs to change, and I will be working to put pressure on the government to protect victims.

Thames Valley Police's Rural Crime Task Force have had some successes in tackling organised waste gangs by working with councils and the Environment Agency, but there is more to be done.

We can all play our part. If you discover fly tipping (large or small) please report it to Vale of White Horse District Council. They can investigate offenders. If you see someone in the act of illegally dumping waste, call 999 - it's a crime in progress!

If you pay someone who is unlicensed to take away your waste, you could be fined £600 if they dump your waste! So it's always worth checking the Environment Agency's website to see if someone is registered.

I understand that locals are checking their doorbell footage in an attempt to find the culprit (s) and I sincerely hope they succeed. If you recognise the item as something you recently got rid off via a waste disposal company, then clearly they were not very good, to put it mildly! Meantime, I'm struggling to believe that it was a local resident who themselves dumped it

work...a much loved member of our community recently had to have a large dead conifer tree cut down, and in the base she found a bee's nest. Ooh err! Step up Sir Matt of Rosum and Bee...what he doesn't know about these buzzy little flying



creatures ain't worth knowing. He went round, worked his magic and hey presto, bees gone, Matt having moved them to a new location where they'll be much happier. Modest Matt told me..."I enjoyed seeing Helen's Red Tail bumblebees (Bombus lapidarius). As beekeepers, we consider it our duty to look after all types of bees, not just Honey Bees. The initial swarm season is over now but they may try again later in the season." Matts honey is seriously delish...I can personally recommend it, and Matt added.. "We've had a good start to the season with over 100kg (220lbs) of honey
