Brown bin permit holders in Vale of

White Horse can have extra garden waste collected for free, on their normal scheduled collection day only, between 27 October and 7 November.

You can put out a maximum of four additional sacks of garden waste, per brown bin subscription, next to the bin.

To be eligible for a collection, the Vale have asked that....

Only present natural garden waste, such as cut grass, plants or small branches.

Use standard sized (60L) black refuse-style sacks or boxes / containers which when combined, total no more than a standard bin-full.

Do not use bags larger than 60L. Our crews will not collect any garden waste from one tonne builders' style waste bags - they are

too heavy to lift and empty into the vehicle. Bags and containers must be left open so crews can easily empty them into the rear of the vehicle and be able to check there are not contaminants.

All the garden waste collected will be taken to a facility near Wallingford where it is composted. The compost is then sold on to local farmers for use on their farmland as a soil conditioner.

Road closure - Monday 10th November, 9am

to 5pm. Yes folks, another one, and here's the official notice, fancy lingo and all!

'Notice is hereby given pursuant to Section 14(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984, that the Oxfordshire County Council TEMPORARILY PROHIBITS THE USE OF THE HIGHWAY BY ALL MOTOR VEHICLES. LOCATION: East Hanney, Brookside (outside Mill Cottage)

REASON: To facilitate bore hole for ground condition and soil sample.

DURATION: (Traffic Regulation Notices cover a maximum of 5 consecutive days.) ACCESS: Limited access will be maintained for emergency service vehicles and for frontages within the closed section of road, subject to the progress of the works. Access will be maintained for cyclists and pedestrians.'

Not sure if that means the work could last five consecutive days! I certainly hope not!! How long does it take to dig a hole and obtain a soil sample? Similar digging going on in West...see page 7

We welcome new Councillor Alexis Pratsides to the Council. This leaves one vacancy on the Parish Council. Once we have a full quote, we will be able to deliver so much more.

The cost of emptying the bins around the village has increased and we are reviewing the providers, with dog bins and waste bins together, we have fifteen to empty. Please report any overflowing bins so that we can assess suitability.

We welcome and support the Black Horse's proposal to host a defibrillator, a valuable asset to the community which would complement those already present at Sovereign Housing offices on the A338 and at the Village Hall. The critical time 'goal' is 3 minutes to have a defibrillator should an incident occur, and the council will determine how best to support this alongside the planned community fund raising.

The footpath from the Iron Bridge to the stile will be improved in the coming months - with more houses, there is more wear and tear and the path needs additional upkeep.

The outdoor gym is open to all and is already being used.

Tree planting - Saturday 22nd November is the planned date - weather permitting. We have another 400 trees which we hope will help fill in the gaps. Your help with planting would be much appreciated. More details to follow on our Facebook and Website.

The Parish Council has recently installed a wheat sculpture at Meadow Way, thanks to a grant from VWHDC.

Thanks to Paul Sayers who is organising the Woodland Working Parties and to everyone who helped - it's making a huge difference! They are held on the last Saturday of every month, do come and join in. The carriageway repairs on the road to Denchworth are progressing well, one side of the road has been completed and the work is on schedule to finish on 7th November.

Thames Water are planning to install a new water main to Meadow Way. The initial work will involve putting boreholes down to check soil samples and ground conditions. A road closure is planned for 10th November.

Please remember to cut back any hedges or branches that are obstructing or overhanging footpaths or other public rights of way.

THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND



November is the month for remembering some of the difficult things that have shaped our world: like the Gunpowder Plot on 5th November. Guy Fawkes and his friends failed to blow up Parliament, but the fear of this kind of treason haunted Britain for centuries. It made the lives of ordinary Catholics in England very difficult for years to come. Fanatical young men often make life miserable for the ordinary people they are trying to save!

On Remembrance Sunday we will be thinking of the millions of lives lost in two World Wars and so many other conflicts around the world. We will be reflecting on how these wars have affected our lives down the generations. My own Mum married the boy next door in 1939. He was in the Royal Navy and was killed when HMS Coventry was sunk in 1942. My Dad was captured by the Japanese in Hong Kong on Christmas Day 1941. After nearly 4 years as a Prisoner-of-War, he was released after the Atom Bombs forced Japan to surrender in August 1945. He met my Mum after he was demobbed in 1946, and they had 60 years of marriage together - a long period of healing after the traumas of war.

Making sense of our stories is the work of a lifetime. I have found this story from ancient China helpful: "There was a farmer in a poor country village. He was considered very well-to-do because he owned a horse

that he used for ploughing and transportation. One day his horse ran away. All his neighbours exclaimed how terrible this was, but the farmer simply replied. 'Maybe.' A few days later the horse returned and brought two wild horses with it. The neighbours all rejoiced at his good fortune, but the farmer simply replied, 'Maybe.' The next day the farmer's son tried to ride one of the wild horses, but the horse threw him and broke the son's leg. The neighbours all offered their sympathy for his misfortune, but the farmer again replied, 'Maybe.' The next week conscription officers came to the village to take young men for the army. They rejected the farmer's son because of his broken. leg. When the neighbours told him how lucky he was, the farmer replied, 'Maybe.'"

As we tell our stories, we set them in a frame that makes them sad or hopeful stories. Sometimes we can see that good things come out of suffering, and that God has been at work in our lives despite everything. As I look back, I see that my Dad had PTSD after the War, and I was afraid of his outbursts. I can see that God did not send the troubles we had, but that he has always been bringing good things out of the harm that others caused.

I have received an update from Rev. Alec Gill on the Parochial Church Council's (PCC) discussion re the maintenance of the Churchyard. Here's what he told me...

"The PCC agreed with those who signed the petition that the maintenance of it is important. Doing so is both an act of preserving our history and providing a place of mourning and reflection for those in our community now and for generations to come.

As good stewards of God's creation, we will continue to develop and refine our maintenance plan of the churchyard, including renaturing and ecological restoration alongside ground maintenance and preserving access to the churchyard. We have taken on board people's comments and concerns. Going forward, we are looking to re-establish a rota for volunteers to help maintain specific areas of the churchyard, as has happened in the past."



Planning for safer communities

My work as Police & Crime Commissioner is not just about working alongside the police. There is collaboration with other blue light emergency services; each county has a body called a Combating Drugs Partnership which is a collection

of police, NHS and public health and a huge overlap into the world of local councils, such as the work of Youth Offending Teams who will become involved when children are arrested by the police

Although not a statutory consultee, there is a particular involvement in the planning process that many people are not aware of. Thames Valley Police employ Crime Prevention Advisors who are consulted on planning applications and major developments. Small changes, such as making sure parking areas are overlooked by neighbouring properties or that alleyways are well lit can help to both reduce crime and make people feel safer.

Sometimes this involves commenting on major projects such as the safety plans at the long awaited new stadium for Oxford United, or seeking to secure funding for policing when significant new housing developments add to local infrastructure needs.

Most recently I have submitted comments to the Vale on the plans for a new traveller



site at Challow station which has caused significant concerns for residents. The scale of the plans would mean a 50% increase to the tiny population already there and would be contrary to the Vale's own Local Plan on a variety of grounds, including road safety.

Ultimately these planning decisions are for local councils to make, but it is important that local people have their say and that safety concerns and issues raised by the police are taken into account. This is why I have recently raised the potential risks of turning off many of the county's street lights. In a large number of our smaller villages, including mine, we do not have street lights, and no-one is arguing to introduce them, but even those of us who are happy without lighting in more rural locations will want to see well lit streets in our more urban areas. It was a significant win to ensure that parish and town councils will now have to agree to any proposals to turn off street lights as a result of public pressure.



"My talk, 'Oxfordshire Place Names', is in two parts. The first is a general outline of how places in Oxfordshire were named. The second involves using a local map of the Hanney area and then finding places that contain given place name elements. It is non-threatening and fun! It works best if people work in pairs or small groups. After a few minutes working on the maps, we all come together to share what we have found. I can supply maps, answer sheets and pencils.
