

THE NIGEL EADY COMMUNITY WOODLAND

Our Woodland was planted between 1993 and 1995 by Nigel Eady of Church Farm as part of a Government-funded scheme to take land out of agricultural production. After Mr Eady died 4 years ago, thanks to skilful negotiation by Chris Surman (Chairman WHPC), his executors gifted the woodland to the Parish Council for the use of the people of E&W Hanney. In addition to the trees and shrubs there is now a wide variety of wildlife. Many kinds of birds are present throughout the year. for example woodpeckers and bullfinches. In winter, abundant migratory redwings and fieldfares feed on the berries and in spring migrating warblers return. Deer and foxes from Cow Lane into the Woodland.

can sometimes be seen. Wild flowers include cowslips and teasels and four species of orchid, all common but nonetheless spectacular when in flower. As well as walkers, often with their dogs. several community groups use the woodland, the Guides, Nordic walkers and, of course, the village school which has a dedicated area for 'Eorest School' activities

With the adjoining field, which the Parish Council has just acquired, the woodland provides a splendid resource for quiet recreation and for wildlife. Come and enjoy. To help with maintenance work email me

East Hanney Parish Council

As you probably know, we are in the process of agreeing the lease of the field to the north of the playing fields. In order to produce plans to consider what the field will be used for, the Parish Council would like to form a working group. If you have any experience or want to help investigate the issues of a possible wild flower meadow, sports field, fitness trail or BMX circuit please get in contact.

On the subject of the village environment, we have also been looking at the problem of the circular iron seats that surround two Horse Chestnut trees opposite La Fontana by the A338. They are in a very bad state. The seats currently surrounding the trees have been cutting into them. To prevent further damage some of the upper rings have already had to be removed.

To compound the problem, some of the iron strips are missing, and many are badly bent out of shape. The seats are constructed of iron bands, which are riveted together. Specialist fabricators have been approached but they are not able to modify or repair them to suit the expanding tree girth.

Recent housing developments have allocated some funds for Village Art projects. This is not something the PC has direct control over but it can suggest possible projects. The PC suggested that this money could be used for replacement seats.

A possible design by Julie Grose, a local artist / blacksmith has been proposed and wider consultation by The Vale's Art Development Officer should occur soon via the Hanney News.

It may be possible that the two existing seats are dismantled and one new circular

seat constructed in a different location. Any feedback and suggestions for a location would be welcome.

Following years of service, the litter pickers that keep the playground and hall car park clean have told the council the no longer wish to undertake the work. The Council is looking for someone to replace them. If you are interested, please contact the Clerk.

Parish Council meetings are open to the public and are held on the first Wednesday of each month at 8pm. The agenda will be available to view on the notice board outside the Community Shop, on the Council's website and on Facebook a week in advance.

Potholes are really increasing throughout the village and as we know Oxfordshire County Council are finding it difficult to keep up, mainly due to cutbacks in funding. The road past Church Farm is an unadopted road and is not therefore the responsibility of the County Council. They have again confirmed that they will carry out repairs to the area once they have completed the development and are ready to lay the final top surface through to the new houses.

Criminal damage is still being carried out, sometimes on a daily basis, at the field entrance opposite the school, and covert cameras are now being considered to identify the offender.


