


The Holly and Christmas Gift Fayre, on Sat 8th



happened to you. We can then contact the police if you want, and refer you to "Victims First", a service which will provide the support you need to recover from your experience. You can report a hate incident or hate crime even if it wasn't directed at you personally."

East Hanney Parish Council

The Parish Council (PC) membership will be up for (re)election on the 2nd May 2019, when the PC will be expanding to 8 members. If you are interested in the village and its community, and would like to help shape its future, please do stand. To find out more, please contact the Clerk by email or telephone. All nominations must be submitted by the 3rd April (at 4pm) and all candidates must be proposed and seconded by voters registered in the village. East Hanney PC, after considering all the arguments, have decided to seek the installation of gates at the entrances to the village on the A338. Evidence from the County Council is that they have a positive effect on traffic calming and along with the potential installation of a Puffin crossing as you will have read in this publication, should make a significant improvement to road safety on the main route through the village. The Council is planning a village celebration in January next year. This will be centred around a bonfire. There are no plans for fireworks, but the event will hopefully include a band and access to the Hall's bar with other refreshments

available! Working with the War Memorial Hall and the St James School PTA, the PC hopes this will be the first of many more annual events. A grant can be sought from the Vale to help get this first event off the ground. To find out more, please contact Cllr McKechnie on smehpc@gmail.com.

To ensure that contributions from developers are used, the PC will be holding a special meeting, probably in the 3rd week in December or early January (date is to be announced, see the noticeboard, website and Facebook page nearer the time) to discuss how your PC can best spend the funds accrued for specific amenities such as improving the play area, sports facilities and public art projects.

You will have seen that your PC has paid for road sweeping along the main routes through the village (Ashfields Lane, The Green, Main Street, Summertown, Mill Orchard, Brookside and the Causeway). This will be supported by gully emptying and jetting, along the same main routes in due course. This supports the County Council's cleansing regime, which has been reduced over the years of austerity.

West Hanney Parish Council

The eagle-eyed amongst you will have spotted that a tree has been felled in the Parish owned wooded area behind the school. We were reluctant to agree to this as it was a Black Poplar, but Scottish and Southern Electricity insisted, due to its proximity with power lines. Work in the Community Woodland will also be carried out over the next few weeks to ensure trees are clear from cables. SSE tell us that they now require around 5 metres clearance.

It is sad to have to report that items are being removed from the woodland. A quantity of wood for use by schoolchildren at their Forest School activities had been transported there by school staff. Much to their disappointment that wood has gone. A small table used by the children and a heavier adapted Picnic Bench have also gone.

Although the woodland is open to all, it is officially owned by West Hanney Parish Council, and looked after by a dedicated band of volunteers. If anyone has any information about the missing items, please contact our Parish Clerk. 17 people turned out for the last working party of this year on Saturday 10th November. Lots of cutting back and scrub clearing was achieved. Thank you to Paul Sayers for his continued work

organising these working parties, and of course to all those hardy folks who turned out for several hours work. Thanks to Kay Sayers who provided her usual delicious cake and refreshments. Very enjoyable! A big thank you also to Des Thomas who continues to keep the rides cut with his tractor and equipment. A further 25kgs of daffodil bulbs have been planted around the village over the past weeks by councillors Chris, Graham and Trevor. Volunteers Rob, Nick and Les also helped. A big thank you to them. Please can we have more volunteers to help with Community Speed Watch. Just 1 hour a month from a few more villagers would help us continue our deterrent against speeding motorists. Thames Water have now doubled the size of the reservoir they are planning to build just a couple of miles from us. If the proposal is successful it will be the size of Heathrow Airport. Now we have an opportunity to nominate them for a 'High Sherriff of Oxfordshire Award'. Here's the official blurb from the Sherriff's office....

Applications are invited for nominations for the High Sheriff Awards for the year 2018/2019.

Every year the High Sheriff of Oxfordshire invites nominations for approximately 20 High Sheriff Awards in recognition of individuals in Oxfordshire who

have made outstanding contributions to the communities in which they live and work. Nominees will usually have had a high impact on the lives of others over a sustained period of time and will be recognised by other people working in the nominee's area as inspirational and as setting an example for others to follow.

The Awards will not normally be made to people whose work and commitment has already been recognised by the award of a National Honour or by bodies such as the Police, the Fire and Rescue Service and Oxfordshire Charity and Voluntary Action.

Nominations can be made by anyone who lives or works in Oxfordshire or who is representing an organisation in the public, voluntary and charitable or private sectors. All nominations will be treated in the strictest confidence and nominees should not be informed that they have been nominated as it can be very disappointing to raise expectations which are then not met.

The Nomination Process

All nominations should be made on the form (I can't find a link to download this form!...Editor) which has been prepared for this purpose and should include the contact details of the nominee as well as the nominator together with a brief summary (400 words max) of the reasons why the nominee merits a High Sheriff's Award.

The deadline for nominations is Thursday 10th January 2019.

The Awards will be conferred at a ceremony in Oxford.

Contributions to Community LifeNominations will be welcome for

people who have made outstanding contributions to any aspect of community life but in the current year nominations in the following area will be particularly welcome.

- 1. Coaching or volunteering in Youth Sport and Youth Leadership organisations.
- 2. Youth projects associated with the Arts and Education.
- 3. Mental health work in the community.
- 4. Communication initiatives in communities.

Two items of infrastructure that

I've mentioned earlier this year are the hideous great concrete blocks on the bridge at Poughley Farm, and the stile at the

end of Snuggs Lane, both in East Hanney. As we approach Christmas, when the standard response to any enquiry seems to be 'Sorry, all closed down till after the New Year', I thought it would be useful to give you an update before everyone gets all festive and silly.

The blocks are still there with no sign of any work being done on the bridge, so I emailed Mr Blockley, the very helpful gent at Oxfordshire County Council to ask for the latest. His response contained mixed news - the budget is still intact, but engineering snags have apparently caused a delay. I quote...

"At a recent meeting with the engineers, I was shown a project timetable and was assured that construction would commence before the end of the financial year."



He added... "As ever, I appreciate the patience and understanding of you and your readers." Thanks to Mr B for his response. He is the poor fellow tasked by the

Council to deal with pestering folk like me in a polite and dignified fashion. He deserves a pay rise, though maybe not the engineers. Let's hope they will get their act together soonest, meaning that in the not too distant future we can say goodbye to those dreadful blocks as well as having a nice new bridge!

What about the stile?...well 'surprise surprise' as our Cilla used to say, it's just that bit older and more rickety looking than ever, with moss and ivy growing on it. Now of course it's also getting damp and very slippery as Winter nears. In spite of approaches to the owner by East

Hanney Parish Council, nothing has been done to improve it, and it remains in a dangerous condition in my humble opinion. The message is clear on this...extreme caution is needed...use at your peril!



Warning!...I don't usually print this kind of 'stuff'...some may see it as overtly political, and in my view that's not the purpose of a parish newsletter.

However, I found it thought-provoking, and well worth a read, with links to both sides of the argument. It was sent by some concerned folk in Garsington to all Parish Clerks. (I have slightly edited it.) At the last East Hanney Parish Council meeting, the councillors described the

This is a choice and is NOT necessary for the residents of Oxfordshire to continue to prosper within the boundaries of the existing landscape and organic population growth. We already have a successful local economy.

The impact of this plan will be... Replacement of our countryside with an urban sprawl of houses, business parks and new roads.

Increased traffic congestion, associated



air pollution and noise.
Further pressure on already stretched public services including schools, hospitals, GP's & social care.
Loss of wildlife habitats.
Increased flood risks.
Potential for Infrastructure failure - e.g. water supplies, sewage systems, roads.

The impacts will be even greater if the government plan to transform the Oxford to Cambridge corridor goes ahead as it has the aspiration for a


