You can shop with confidence, knowing that the Citizens Advice helpline is there to help with a consumer problem – if you need to return faulty goods, if you've

bought something fake or counterfeit, or if something you've ordered hasn't arrived.
The Citizens Advice consumer helpline (03454 040506) is open Monday to Friday 9 - 5 (closed bank holidays). Advisers will answer your call, explaining how you can pursue your claim. They cannot make a complaint or take legal action on your behalf but they can give you practical and impartial advice, explain the law which applies to your situation,

and also pass complaints to Trading Standards for you.

Before you call the helpline, prepare by jotting down the factual details of your

problem, such as when you paid for the item or service; how much you paid; how you paid; the seller's name and address; and what you have done so far to resolve the issue. Citizens Advice can also be



Dear Sir,

I believe I am right in saying that a temporary permission was granted to Messrs. Sweetcroft to allow for access and storage to their building site over agricultural land that they own accessed from Cow Lane. I also understood they were required to remove spoil and materials at the completion of their construction works and to restore the land to its original agricultural condition.

It seems to me that the development is now substantially, if not entirely,

complete yet there continue to be many lorries visiting the site, including many large loads of tree and shrub cuttings that feed an ongoing succession of bonfires.

I have written to our Vale Council representative, Matthew Barber, but await a response. I am sure I am not the only Hanney resident who is very concerned indeed that this strictly temporary arrangement does not become permanent by default, and I would be grateful if one of your top investigative reporters could take on the task of discovering when Sweetcroft plan to restore the field to its agricultural state.

East Hanney Parish Council

Want to meet your Councillors and speak about things that the Council is planning or to learn more about what the Council does? Members of the Council will be available in the Olde Hanney Room of the Hall from 7pm on the 15th February to speak with you. The bar will be open should you need refreshment.

Please do come along even if it is just for a chat about what the Council does, or to discuss any issues or matters that you might like to bring to the Councils attention. Also, if you might be interested in joining or seeing how you could help with those aspects of the village and village life for which the Council is responsible. There are, as you may be aware, elections in May this year, and there are now some additional places for new Councillors.

Your council has agreed its budget for the coming year. As ever consideration has been given to ensuring the provision of services and facilities for which East Hanney Parish Council is responsible, and to provide for the maintenance and provision of new facilities, such as mentioned below.

It has planned to continue the work with an outside contractor to sweep the main routes through the village and empty the gullies twice in the 2019-20 year. It is hoped that this will be undertaken in conjunction with West Hanney PC to maximise the cost effectiveness of this service. In order to keep the rise in precept as low as possible, the Council had to take the difficult decision to stop providing the skip. The precept will rise with the consumer price index measure of inflation in October 2018, meaning that a typical band D property will see a rise of 2.2%.

Plans are underway to improve the sports and play facilities in the parish. This is to be funded using money received from the developers that have built new homes in the village. For sports, this could include rugby posts on the newly leased field, new goal nets for the adult football pitch on the playing field and a new cricket net along with refurbishing the cricket net floor. On the playground, a small multiuse games area with goals and basketball nets is being considered. It may be possible to use the arts money to have some 'free play' and climbing items made of wood or stone, similar to a trim trail, some pieces of equipment aimed at children of a younger age and some more large pieces of equipment, including a hanging slide track.

West Hanney Parish Council

Residents have been commenting on the state of the road edges in several areas of our village where they have become very unsightly with accumulations of mud and leaves. Gullies are being blocked and causing floods across the road, especially in Church Street. As Oxfordshire County Council now rarely

control the situation, your parish council have had to pay for private contractors to do the work for us. We have also recently agreed another contract to have safety handrails installed on the steps from the highway to the raised footpath on School Road. This work was scheduled to be completed by the middle of January.

Sweetcroft are continuing

to remove their equipment from the latest development at Church Farm and are aiming to be off site by the end of January/Mid February. The Directors have told us that, once the works are complete, they have no problem with walkers using the retained strip of land south of the existing footpath and adjoining the Community Meadow gifted

to the village. Residents should however refrain from using the main field fronting School Road as this is still Sweetcroft property.

Large amounts of waste have been dumped along the road edges towards Southmoor, blighting the area. It looks as if the rubbish is from a tiling and/or a

bathroom refurbishment job. Anyone who is having any work carried out should ensure that their contractor has a waste carrying licence as any evidence found showing where the work had been carried out could make the householder liable for a hefty fly tipping fine. A drone has been reported being flown in the Church Street area during the night at around 1.30am.

Yes 1.30am! The matter has been reported to the police who have promised to step up patrols in the area, as this could be classified as disturbing the peace and invasion of privacy. If anyone has any information then please contact the police by ringing 101. Your call can remain confidential.

A subject that often comes up

in conversations - well, the ones I have anyway - is the relative population sizes of our local towns and villages. I think we will have to wait for the next census in 2021 for those figures, but those for the number of dwellings are available. They've been produced by the Vale of White Horse District Council to help the Parish Councils set their 'precept' levels, the 'local' charge added to our council tax bills.

So just for interest, here's a selection of the number of dwellings in local towns and villages, including ours, starting with the big three...

First it's **Abingdon** of course, with 14,837...that's a 'lorra lorra lot' as our Cilla would have said!

Wantage is next with 5,574, then **Faringdon** with 3,487. Nearly the same size is **Grove** with 3,104...many more than I expected.

Now focussing on towns and villages very local to us, the next biggest is

Kingston Bagpuize and Southmoor with 1,251. **Drayton** is also in four figures, with 1,077.

Stanford in the Vale is next with 976, closely followed by **Steventon** with 900 and **Marcham** on 885.


East Hanney is next with 438, then **West Hanney** with 249.

Ardington and Lockinge has 220, with **Charney Bassett** on 125.

Frilford has 87, Denchworth 80, Garford 69, Goosey 56, and last, but by no means least, little Lyford with 23.

The photo below shows the gent from the Vale, pausing to strike a quick pose as he makes his round, counting all the houses in West Hanney. He points at each one with his brolly and shouts loudly....'47, 48, 49, 50, 51'.

But oh dear, he's going to stop for some refreshment in the Plough - the building on the left in the snap - and by the time he's slated his thirst, he'll have likely forgotten how many he'd got up to and have to go back to the beginning again.

Dear Friends,

These words challenge me to keep seeing myself as God sees me and to define myself by what I can do and not what I can't do. To be bold in my actions, caring in my relationships and discerning with my choices.

All I need to do now is just get this pesky tune out of my head!

Winter is a good time of year, when the vegetation has died back,

The Hanneys Flood Group

to consider the ditches, streams and culverts around the village, which we all rely on being clear to minimise the risk of flooding. Many people erroneously believe "The Council" are responsible for the ditches around the village - this is not so. If you own a house or have land adjoining or with a watercourse running through, you have certain responsibilities. In legal terms you are the "Riparian Owner". If your land boundary is next to a watercourse it is assumed you own the land up to the centre of the watercourse. Riparian owners are responsible for the maintenance of any watercourses that run alongside or through their property. Examples include householders in Main Street, Winter Lane, Ebbs Lane, Ashfields Lane, and every house and farm that backs onto or has Letcombe Brook as a boundary.

The Environment Agency "Living on the Edge" publication states that water must be able to flow through your land without any obstruction, pollution or diversion which affects the rights of others. Banks need to be clear of anything that could cause an obstruction

and increase flood risk, either on your land or downstream. Riparian owners are also responsible for maintaining the banks of the watercourse and the trees and shrubs growing on them. Any litter

and animal carcasses must be removed from the channel and banks, even if

they did not come from your land. Water courses cannot be used to dispose of garden or other waste or left where it could be washed into the water - this especially includes grass cuttings which pollute the water and kill wildlife. If your property has culverts – there are many along Main Street in East Hanney and Winter Lane in West Hanney, you own them from where they enter to the point they leave your land. Riparian **owners** are responsible for keeping culverts clear and maintaining any on their land. Restricted or blocked culverts means the water may back up and cause flooding. It is your responsibility to let water through your land (culvert) without obstruction. This means you must clear a blocked culvert on your land or under your property. 
How is the 'Puize' bit of 'Kingston Bagpuize' pronounced?

'Wheeze', as in 'a jolly iape', or 'Pews' - what you sit on in church? It's not a new problem by the way. This lovely map, drawn in about 1760 by Thomas Kitchen clearly shows that Kingston Bagpuize was called 'Kingston Baptist' many years ago, so they were getting it wrong way back then.

In fact, previous maps going right back to one made in 1574 by another chap who was pretty useful with his jumbo pack of Crayolas - one Christopher Saxton - shows Kingston Bagpuize as 'Baptist', and subsequent map makers, including Tom Kitchen, probably just copied his error.

The reason for the mistake may have been that the map maker, on enquiring of the locals the name of their town, misunderstood the answer, which presumably was delivered in a thick Oxfordshire accent.

Another theory is that the name 'Baptist' was included because of the name of the church at Kingston, 'St John the Baptist'. However, a map made soon after Kitchen's by John Rocque showed the town as Kingston Bagpuze...no 'i'. This from the Doomsday Book of Berkshire of 1086 tells us.... "Henry de Ferrers holds Kingston with Ralph of Bagpuize as his sub-tenant".



Apparently Ralph came from Bacquepuis which is in Normandy, northern France. Maybe he was a pal of William, Duke of Normandy, better known as William the Conqueror, who, you'll recall, rather threw his weight around back in 1066.

The current Kingston Bagpuize website states "How do you pronounce Bagpuize? It is pronounced by twentieth-century villagers as Bagpews!" (I assume that 21st Century villagers also pronounce it that way?) I suspect however, that various pronunciations will continue unless the good burgers rename their ever expanding town. Maybe 'Kingston Bagpipes' or 'Kingston Bagpuss'? We need a 'People's Vote' on that one! Sincere thanks to Andy Robertson and Paul Sayers of our splendid History Group for all the information. If this kind of stuff floats your proverbial canoe, then do consider joining their group.


