A338 Pedestrian Crossing

You are probably reading this after East Hanney Parish Council (EHPC) held a public consultation regarding the future of the much needed crossing. It is/was on 27th March. As I write, it is still a week away, so I know not the outcome.

I sincerely hope that common sense prevailed and that EHPC, and other folk too, are - without delay - pressuring Oxfordshire County Council to find the funds and build the much needed crossing, even though it will mean the removal of approx half the long hedge on the western side of the A338, and the erection of 3 street lights. It is a small price to pay for the massive benefits in terms of road safety for all the folk - there are many - who live on the eastern side of the road, and indeed, anyone who ever needs to cross it.

East Hanney Parish Council

You will have noticed that since the winter, the dog and general waste bins have not been emptied regularly, if at all. Cllr McKechnie has undertaken to empty them on more than one occasion, as has the Clerk and public-spirited members of the community. Happily, your Council has now identified a new contractor to empty the dog waste bins, so the good service that we once enjoyed should be resumed. It is worth noting that the new contractor does not empty general waste bins. The PC continues to seek a solution to that problem.

At its March meeting, East Hanney Parish Council noted that as a small authority, it is able to fund activities that fall outside its statutory remit, such as supporting clubs and societies, to a maximum of just over £6,000. This figure changes annually, set by central government. At present, your Parish Council makes donations to local groups equating to approximately £2500. This matter will be raised again at the Council's April meeting, where, as the Council is in purdah, such matters are appropriate to be considered fully. It is also hoped that at its April meeting, EHPC will be able to consider the

numerous amendments that Bovis and Origin 3 are putting forward to their proposals for 50 and 55 dwellings on Dews Meadow. Should the Vale not be willing to provide this length of extension to respond, the Council will report its views on the proposals. The amendments have been submitted despite the proposal for 45 being approved by the Vale's planning committee and the developer starting the groundwork. This is another example, in our small village alone, of developers pushing the spirit of the planning system to its limit in their desire to increase profitability. As you are no doubt aware, all the eight seats on the Parish Council will be up for election this year. Nomination papers may be obtained from the Clerk. Key dates are set out below. Should you wish to stand and cannot deposit the nomination papers at the VWHDC offices by hand as is required,

the Clerk is able to take them for you on Friday 29th March.

Please contact the Clerk if you wish to avail yourself of this service.

West Hanney Parish Council

Oxfordshire County Council have recently circulated a Town and Parish Council Survey asking what work is undertaken by the Parish Council, and whether we would be prepared to undertake more. Examples of the questions are:-

Does your community undertake any work on the public highway? What type of work is your community involved in? Vegetation clearing? Snow Clearance? Road Gritting? Sign Cleaning? Footway Clearance? Public Rights of Way Maintenance?

They have then asked who carries out this work? Paid employees, contractors, volunteers, and if our community would be interested in undertaking other work beyond the work currently funded and delivered by Oxfordshire Highways. There were 13 questions in all which we have answered in the way we feel is appropriate. We are a small village with only five Parish Councillors and a Clerk. Parish Councillors are all unpaid volunteers and in our Village none claim any expenses whatsoever.

The only suggestion which may have some merit given the current state of the roads is a suggestion that we have a 'Highways Super User' – a trained volunteer who can inspect potholes and order works directly from OCC's Highway Contractor.

In terms of road conditions at the time of going to press Highways are beginning extensive repair works in Church Street and Main Street.

Two Councillors are standing down in May. We already have one resident who has agreed to join which means there will be one other vacancy for a new Parish Council member. If you would like to give something back to your village then please contact any councillor or our clerk for a chat.

The footpath saga relating to the 15 new houses off School Road is ongoing. Although Highways have now accepted the sensible option of a path inside the field from the development to the school they are still trying to insist that a 2 metre footway is provided from the existing public footpath to the west of the site along the short distance to 'Hanney Spice'. Further they are suggesting that the existing footway needs lights. Both your parish council and Neil Walker's agent have advised OCC that this is not in the interests of a small village that has narrow footpaths around all the roads. A meeting between all parties is being sought and the debate continues.

I am writing to you to express the views of the residents of Halls Lane concerning the replacement of the bridge at the end of Halls Lane.

Nobody in Halls Lane wants this bridge repaired or replaced as it is not required now alternative access to Poughlev Farm has been supplied. The bridge was initial damaged by massive lorries taking sand and material to the farm and the expense of replacing the bridge should be met by the beneficiary not the taxpayer. The road closure has removed the noise and nuisance of vehicles that are too big for the road driving all over the road embankments and Halls Lane is not capable of carrying any further traffic due to its width, tight curves and poor condition. We have had relief from the constant green roader vehicles that use this bridleway throughout the year and the bridle path is now usable by pedestrians where previously it was too cut up to use unless you were on horseback. The bridge should be retained as a footpath and would be easily adapted to do so from the current structure. In the current financial climate the money could be used to improve facilities for everyone in the village and not one commercial operator who will be the sole beneficiary of the budget expenditure. **Clive Hetherington**

THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND

Dear Friends,

Recently, I have heard a few new words that I am getting my head around; our bodies can get into a <u>parasyemparthetic state</u>, our minds have the capability of neuroplasticity and we need to be concerned at the rise of what-about-ism!

During March and April, the church has a 40-day countdown to Easter called Lent. It is a time to give up or take up things that will benefit our relationship with God. One of the words we associate with Lent is temptations, but what does it mean? Apart from being a long-running Motown ensemble group, we usually think of temptations as things we shouldn't do but like anyway; eating cake and drinking wine!

Jesus was tempted in the desert for 40 days. He was tempted with turning stones into bread (he was hungry), changing his allegiance and gaining authority over the nations and demonstrating his power and identity as God's son to others. Now, these seem to be okay things to do. We can think about temptations in terms of having too much of a good thing or as bad things that we shouldn't do. The news reminds us that people are tempted with many different moral choices and our actions can have a damaging effect on ourselves and others.

Sometimes, the choices that we have can seem like Jesus' temptations; not really bad things in themselves. The reason why Jesus said no to his temptations was because of his friendship with God; he had committed to fasting for God, was only going to serve God and was not going to show-off just to win followers for God. Jesus said no to things that would harm his relationship with God.

When we face decisions in life, they may not be clearly right or wrong; we could do this, or we could do that? Which should we choose? I am challenged by Jesus to consider the impact of my decisions on the most important relationship in my life; how does doing this affect my friendship with God, my family or my relationships with others?

Sometimes we need to say no to something, when we are tempted to say yes, not because it is a bad thing to do. But, by saying no, we are actually saying yes to an important relationship in our lives; to prioritising those most important to us, by not spreading our time commitments to thinly and by keeping our promises to our loved ones.


