Hanney News is produced by the Hanney News Association, (HNA) which is 'unincorporated' - i.e. we don't make a profit. HNA comprises myself as Editor, Chris French as Treasurer and Paul Haines as Chief Distributor.

We answer to no one...be it Parish, District or County Councils, the Church, Harry and Megan, Greta, the Beeb, Boris, Russian oligarchs, Jamaican Yardies, Chinese Triads, Sicilian Mafiosi...you get the point, I'm sure!

Our sole source of income is the fees we charge our commercial advertisers, and our only expenditure is our monthly printing bill. (We use the great local company Artisan who are up in Kingston Bagpuss. I can highly recommend them.) No one involved in producing the mag takes a penny for their sometimes quite extensive and time consuming efforts. Since Chris took over responsibility for the piggy bank in 2013, our finances have improved to the point that back in 2017, we were able to start giving funds to local good causes and organisations. I don't believe that's happened before in the 45 year history of the mag.

Since then we've handed out a total of over £3,250. Our most recent donation was to the West Hanney Aunt Sally team who needed some netting erected before they could play their traditional Oxfordshire game in the Plough pub garden without endangering the lives and limbs of other folk who happened to be in said establish-

ment at the same time!

During the very difficult Covid time we're all going through, we've been able to give all our commercial advertisers six months free advertising.

Very few of our advertisers drop out, and we have a waiting list for those seeking to take space with us.



A338 Crossing:

Oxfordshire County Council have completed their designs and appointed a contractor. Once the funding has been released from the current development on the Steventon Rd, it is hoped to start construction during the summer school holidays in order to minimise the disruption to the traffic along the A338.

The Playground:

On a recent inspection of the playground, Councillors found that one of the pieces of much loved equipment had been deliberately damaged. Whilst there is minimal risk to users due to the damage, we have had to request an inspection by specialist playground engineers to assess and fix the damage, which could be costly to the parish. Village Hall Update

Some of our regular groups have returned to the Hall after some restrictions lifted on May 17th, but some have decided to delay their return until September. Following the announcement by Boris on June 14, the following restrictions will continue to apply until we enter Stage 4 of the roadmap, hopefully on July 19:

1. No social events such as children's parties, family parties and birthday parties can take place in the Hall.

2. Choirs cannot rehearse in the Hall.

3. All activities must follow social distancing rules and so the capacity of the Hall is currently reduced to 28 for physical activities.

4. Seated meetings of up to 60 people can take place but attendees must sit in family groups and be socially distanced from other groups.

The orchids in the community woodland should be flow-

ering in July, although the cold April and wet May means they are likely to flower several weeks later than last year, please look out for these on your walks in the community woodland. I would like to



thank Des Thomas for continuing to cut the rides using his vintage 'Fergie' tractor, helping to keep our community woodland accessible.

The village gates, approaching West Hanney from the north have been replaced, together with new 30mph signs; thanks to Oxfordshire County Council for doing this work

You may have heard of the significant changes being proposed for Oxfordshire by the independent 'Boundary Commission'. They are suggesting moving the Faringdon, Kingston Bagpuize, Stanford and 'Watchfield & Shrivenham' wards from the Wantage constituency into Witney. Also to move Marcham from Wantage into Oxford West and Abingdon, and Sandford and the Wittenhams from Henley into Wantage, which will then get an official new name: 'Didcot and Wantage'. The purpose is to give each MP roughly the same number of electors, as currently, constituencies in England range from 55,000 to 100,000 people.

As of now, Wantage is 91,000, and the proposals would reduce it to 71,000. You can read all the details on the Boundary Commission's website, and give yours views on the proposals up until **2nd August**.

If you're new to the area, here's a very brief summary of a few places not far away that are well worth a visit.

One of our favourites when our kids were younger was the **Cotswold Wildlife Park**. It's about a 35 minute drive from Hanney, and, as well as a fabulous selection of animals, it also has a superb adventure playground and a narrow gauge railway where you get to trundle round the very picturesque park and wave at complete strangers as you pass by. They will almost certainly wave back equally enthusiastically, which is nice. That said, the train may not be operating at present due to Covid. Website is: **www.cotswoldwildlifepark.co.uk**. I took the giraffe pic a few years back. He maybe a 'she'? - is wishing me 'Good morn-

ing' in Swahili, though that's me being silly, cos in fact giraffes don't make much noise at all. It's just that with it's mouth open, I couldn't resist giving the giraffe a speech bubble. You can get up close and personal with these magnificent creatures thanks to a tall structure that allows you to climb up to be level with their heads!

Didcot Railway Centre is also well worth a visit. It's next to Didcot Parkway railway station, so loads of parking. During past visits we've met Thomas the Tank Engine there, and the Fat Controller, who wasn't quite as rotund as I expected. Their website is: **didcotrailwaycentre.co.uk**.

Also local - just north of Carterton, so again a 30 - 35 minute drive - is

'Crocodiles of the World'.

We've never been, but check out the website...it looks a great place to visit, and, as with the Wildlife Park and the Railway Centre, is very child friendly. If you do pay a visit, I'd be most interested to hear



your thoughts. Their website is: crocodilesoftheworld.co.uk.

Finally, another place well worth a look is **Cogges Manor Farm** in Witney. Their website is **www.cogges.org.uk**. They have plenty of farm animals, loads of child-friendly activities and you can even get married there should the mood take you!

How do you react when you need to complain?

Are you fuelled by righteous anger or motivated by the drive to see justice done? Do you just want to get it sorted out and move on?

Or is making a complaint something that you would prefer to avoid?

As a child I was told to complain nicely. Because the first person we speak to about a complaint may have had nothing to do with what went wrong and you may need their help to get the problem fixed.

Generally, I don't like having to go and make a complaint. Weirdly, I feel embarrassed about having to speak up about something that others have gotten wrong! Who it is that we are complaining to, can also have an impact on us. While I have gotten used to pointing out problems with my food in a restaurant, I got very nervous when I had to go and speak to the head teacher at a school, where we used to live, to complain about a teacher showing one of my children's class the open scene from Jaws; it's a great film but as a 12 certificate, it's not really suitable for primary school viewing!

Complaining can be hard to do, but for me, complaining to certain people can be even scarier. And yet, this is exactly what the Bible tells us to do with God. Yes, the Bible says a lot about saying how great God is, thanking God and asking for God's help. But it also features people complaining to God. The book of Psalms, a collection of 150 songs, is filled with passages where the writer is complaining about their situation and questioning why God isn't doing something about it. The book of Lamentations is one giant outpouring of suffering and complaint. The Old Testament character of Job is famous for demanding to air his complaints face-toface with God.

The thing about all this complaining in the Bible, is that God is big enough to take it. In fact, it seems that God has no problem with us giving it both barrels when we pray. God wants us to be honest and that includes being open about our complaints as much as our praise.

We can come to the Creator of the Universe and lay out all our frustrations and complaints about our lives and ask why God hasn't done something about this, because the Bible says that God will protect, provide and guide us. So, we can ask; God, what's going on?

Complaining to God has helped me to express my pain and anger, it has helped me gain perspective on what is happening in my life and it has stopped resentment from becoming a barrier between myself and God. I don't always get an answer to my complaints and some I make more than once, but I have learnt that they are an important part of having a healthy and open relationship with God.


