

East Hanney Neighbourhood Plan Progress

The draft Neighbourhood Plan for East Hanney was published for its Regulation 14 Consultation in December, and **remains open for receipt of comments until 8**th **February 2022**. Information on how to do that is on page 6.

The draft plan sets out proposed planning policies for the village and reasons for the policies, it also includes a Design Guide specific for East Hanney.

The policies, once approved, form part of the planning requirements that are considered by the Planning Authorities. The Plan that has been developed for East Hanney has been informed by a community survey and a number of village events. It is currently in a draft form and is subject to consideration of the responses received from this consultation.

Please do look at the Plan and give your comments. All comments received will be taken into consideration for the next stage and are welcomed.





East Hanney Parish Council

Its been a busy period!

There is a lot to update on this month, with a number of initiatives for improvements in the village now underway.

Draft Neighbourhood Plan Consultation. As you may be aware the draft East Hanney Neighbourhood Plan has been prepared for its Regulation 14 Consultation which commenced on 21st December. Enormous thanks to everyone who helped contribute to the formulation of the draft plan either by attending events, suggesting recommendations, participating in the survey, or by providing content. Thanks also to residents of East Hanney who have already provided comment on the draft of the Plan. If you have not done so yet, your comments are invited and will be taken into consideration for the next stage of the Plan and form part of the Consultation. The consultation is open for comments until 8th February 2022 and can be viewed at:

www.easthanneyparishcouncil.org.uk/neighbourhood-plan.html.

There is also a hard copy at the shop. Comments can be given in a number of ways including through the East Hanney Parish Council website, by way of email to ... EHPCConsultation@gmail.com, by post to EHPC, or by using a hard copy form available in the village shop that can be posted into the EHPC Mailbox which is on the wall outside the shop, next to the bench.

Playground facility improvements. The Council has begun a procurement process to enhance and improve the play facilities at the sports field. This is needed because there has been a significant increase in use of the current equipment, much of which is old, and because our facilities are limited, especially for the very young.

This will incorporate ideas from users themselves; schoolchildren at St James submitted some fantastic drawings which will give the designers a solid starting point. The intent is to provide a revised playscape facility inclusive of some new equipment.

Car Park extension and MUGA facilities. The plans for both an extension of the car park at the village hall and the provision of Muga facility on the East Hanney Parish Council-owned part of the sports field continue to be progressed. The planning application has been updated to provide for some additional spaces; it is hoped that up to a further 34 spaces can be approved. This is still subject to planning consent, but when received we hope to be able to implement the works quickly.

Annual Parish Budget Both the improvement in playground facilities and the car park will need to be funded through the Parish Council as there has been no financial support made available to the Parish for this. At its January meeting the Council approved a budget which set aside a provision to enable these initiatives to be progressed. The extent of play facilities will depend on the cost of quotes received, but we are hopeful that both of these improvements to the village infrastructure for community use will be achieved. The annual budget includes the setting of precept for the next 12 months from April annually, and despite the expenditure needed for village facilities, the precept is expected to increase by approximately £1 per month per band D property. Details of the actual amount of precept per property is expected to be announced by the District Council in March.

East Hanney Parish Council - continued

Waste Bins - If you have not already seen them around the village, we are pleased to announce the arrival of some new style waste bins. So far, the Council has purchased and installed two of the new bins which are made of recycled material and more suited to a village environment than a traditional metal bin. The bin pictured is now in situ at the end of the pathway from the iron bridge to Main Street. Let us know what you think and whether



we should start to replace some of the other older bins in the same style?



And Finally...we hope that everyone

who brought their old Christmas tree to the recycling service found it useful. Over 122 trees have been chipped and used on footpaths around the village. Thanks go to Councillor Green for providing this.

You may remember that some years back there was talk of demolishing the railway bridge at Steventon, in order to allow the electrification of the railway beneath it. (Same reason of course that the lovely old bridge at Grove also bit the dust.) The demolition and subsequent building of a replacement at Steventon was reckoned to be likely to take at least ten months, probably longer, and would have meant severe disruption for all of us - there are many - who use Didcot, its station, and the M4. It was stated at the time that, unlike Grove, the new bridge could not be built until the old one had been demolished. Following much local pressure, Network Rail (NR) and others found ways to keep the bridge - it's a Grade II listed structure. built in approx. 1839, and designed by Isambard Kingdom Brunel.

NR carried out 'extensive and breakthrough testing, which included the use of

computer-based simulation software' and the results, published in April 2020, reprieved the bridge. It meant that trains had to reduce their speed somewhat from 125 mph!

Now. less than two years later, comes bad news...Oxfordshire County Council (OCC) engineers suggest that the 'brickwork is weak', according to a recent Oxford Mail article of 29th Dec 2021. OCC Councillor Tim Bearder. **Cabinet Member for Highways** Maintenance, - remember him, he chipped in on the '20's Plenty' campaign (hope he's still sporting his fine beard?) - stated that... "It is always difficult when these vital pieces of infrastructure begin to deteriorate, but inaction is not an option." It's worth noting that the bridge is owned and maintained by OCC,

so there may be some who would say that they haven't done a great job of looking after it.

Judgements like that are way above my pay -grade, but I did have a word with our very own house-trained, tame, structural engineer - not all are! - and he opined that this is probably another case of erring very heavily on the side of safety...a backside-covering exercise some may think. Whatever, traffic restrictions have now been placed on the bridge, and as we say in the global press world, this story has legs.

PS: If the technicalities of all this stuff about railway bridges and choo choo trains floats your canoe - should that be 'gets your big iron wheels rotating' if we are sticking with the railway theme? - then you'll enjoy this....


Her proudest moment was winning the FITSTEPS National Dance competition in 2018 which was judged by the Strictly Stars and voted for by the general public.




I just got a job at a bicycle factory. I work in the department that makes the wheels, so I'm their new spokesperson!

"Super-calloused fragile mystic vexed with halitosis! Um diddle diddle diddle um diddle aye!"

(You'll be pleased to hear that's the last of my jokes involving Mary Poppins songs!)

Last month I mentioned street-

lights. or rather the lack of them in Hanney. My piece was not strictly accurate - is anything in Hanney News? - since the short culde-sac 'Morlands' in East Hanney does have them...well, three anyway, see lower pic. I assume they were installed when the houses were built. In West Hanney I was sure there were none, and, strictly speaking I'm right, but long term resident and all round 'good egg' Peter Scott has pointed out that sometime after he moved to his bungalow, West Cottage (see article on page 16) he installed a street lamp in his front garden that he saved from being thrown on the scrap heap in the late 1970s. Back then, no one was that bothered about reusing or recvcling, so well done to Peter... a true visionary!

His lamppost still stands proud - see upper

pic - in the front garden of West Cottage, clearly visible from the road, and is of a rather splendid cast iron, fluted design, with a little door in it. Originally gas, Peter converted it to electricity and put it on a timer switch.

I don't know if the current owners of West Cottage ever switch it on....my walk to the Plough next door means I don't go quite as far as the cottage! There's more on street lighting from scientists... they say that light pollution may be contributing to the worrying insect decline seen in recent decades, and street lights were found to disrupt the behaviour of nocturnal moths, (I thought all moths were nocturnal?) reducing caterpillars numbers by half. Whatever, we'll have no streetlights here, thank you very much!



Hanney Historical Calendar 2022 - the February photo is a lovely pic of 'West Cottage' that was attached to The Plough back in the day.

Probably built about the same time as the Plough in the eighteenth century, the photo was almost certainly taken in the early 1940s, and, as well as the buildings, features a

lady leaning on her gate with her dog.

Research reveals her to be Rita Belcher, in her mid/late teens at the time. Anyone know the dog's name? Rita lived there with her parents Percy and Alice, and possibly a brother called Alfie. The bicycle propped up against the kerb was almost certainly Rita's, which she used to cycle to work every day in Didcot, a journey of about 10 miles. Back then, there was a slight short cut into Didcot alongside the railway track, accessible from the bridge at Steventon.

The family rented the cottage and it was pretty basic - a well in the garden (behind the dry stone wall on the left side of the pic) supplied the water, there was no kitchen and an outside loo.

Talking of water, when a very small child, Rita had to be rescued after she fell in Eddins Pond - see bottom pic - which was at the far end of Church Street and sadly, no longer exists. She left home when she married John Gregory, a farmer from Steventon. Whilst they were courting, John would ride over from his farm to West Hanney on a great big shire horse!

After their daughter Rita left home, Percy and Alice moved to Grove.

Rita sadly died young, aged only 45, with John living to be 90.

The cottage was most likely demolished in the early 1960s, by which time it was semiderelict, and probably owned by a Mr and Mrs Keeling, who certainly built the bungalow, also called West Cottage, that exists on the site today.

Of course the Plough too continues as a pub, and is now - but was not back then - the only pub in West Hanney. The cottage at the far end of the pub is still a home.

The top photo is the one that appears in the calendar. Below it is a more recent pic of the cottage, I would guess in the 1950s, and below that is a view from the other direction with the Plough nearer to camera.




