**Hanney** remains closed, but by the time you read this, it will be very close to being, or already be

open! Great news indeed, and so long as folk support it, I'm sure a bright and prosperous future awaits.

It's been a bumpy road since it first opened as a 'Community pub' in May 2015, and it's only thanks to an ongoing team effort and support from many locals, good burgers of both of East and West Hanney, that it still exists today.

Given that many folk deserve our thanks for their efforts, it is perhaps unwise to mention just three individuals, but I'm going to anyway!

The first is Dave Bratley, the gent who recognised the very real threat that we may lose the pub altogether once Punch Taverns - the then owners - put it up for sale. His action in calling a meeting and alerting the community meant that wheels were set promptly in motion to ensure that didn't happen.



The second is Phil Larder, who has over the years has devoted a very large amount of time indeed and a wealth of expertise to

the maintenance of the fine old building. The final name to mention is Chris French. His tireless efforts since the beginning of the process have been the single biggest reason we still have a pub, and as I write, he is spending long hours preparing the Plough for the new tenants.

This latest effort from him in spite of the

fact that he has resigned from the Hanney Pub Co. board of directors after having served on it for seven of the seven and a half years it has been in existence.

Chris - along with everyone else of course - has worked entirely voluntarily. He now wishes - and deserves! - to step back and simply enjoy the pub...he's more than 'done his hit'.

We offer our sincere thanks to Chris, Dave, Phil and all the other worthy souls whose collective input means that Mrs Editor and I will be seen regularly heading down from Global HQ, bound for the pub!

**'The History, Ecology and Management of Letcombe Brook'** was the title of a most interesting recent walk organised by the Hanney History Group. #### **East Hanney Parish Council**

We welcome Sally Povolotsky as our new Ward Councillor, and if you don't know Sally, you soon will. Sally already has a list of concerns from the PC and has begun to address them on your behalf despite, as I write, her only being in the job for 5 days.

On the 11th May the Planning Committee approved planning permission for 44 homes north of Ashfield's Lane despite presentations to the Committee from your PC and Sally that flooding is an issue that was not satisfactorily addressed within the application. The Committee ruled that permission is granted but it is subject to the developer securing an agreed plan with the County Drainage Officer before a spade touches the ground. The PC will be requesting that we are to be kept up to date so our own consultant can analyse and comment.

I do hope that everyone in the village will attend at least one event over the Jubilee weekend, the volunteers have put a lot of their time and effort into making this a weekend where for the first time in at least two years we can meet as a community, so make use of the break.

#### Two of the many jewels in the

**Hanney crown** are our community halls: the Royal British Legion (RBL) and the Hanney War Memorial Hall (HWMH). Both are available for hire on a regular basis, e.g. for clubs and classes, and on a one-off basis - parties, and the like.

The RBL Hall is run by Carl and Suzanne you can contact them via their website: www.hanneyroyalbritishlegion.co.uk, or by phone, 07984 721629, or 01235 868672 The HWMH is run by a committee, currently headed by Graham Garner: phone is 868864, or visit their website for more info and to book: hwmh.thehanneys.uk/ The Hall is a charity registered with the Charity Commission, number is 300096. It offers all mod-cons, and it is one of the best equipped in the county. The RBL hall is also fully equipped and both make great venues for throwing a party!

Confusion occasionally crops up with the HWMH, since it is also often known simply as the 'Village Hall'.

Hanney's actual War Memorials – one for each of the World Wars - are in St James church in West Hanney, some distance away from the hall.

Prior to the hall's opening in 1970, there existed a wooden hall known as the 'Victory Hut.' It was built in 1919 to celebrate victory in the First World War. The story has it that the then Headmaster of St James School, one Harry Edwards, sourced it from Wokingham where it was owned by the YMCA.

Many jolly events were regularly held in it, including dances - sometimes twice a week - which attracted folk from far and wide, including three popular young ladies who used to come over from Denchworth, and Polish servicemen from Kingston Bagpuss - well, they were from Poland originally of course, but were staying in KB! - and US soldiers. Music was supplied by a Mr Dickie White in the 1930s, a farmer from East

Hanney with a record player, and the sometimes vigorous efforts of the dancers often caused clouds of cough-inducing dust to rise from the rickety floorboards! The hut was heated by two stoves, one at each end and on occasion, youngsters would climb onto the roof - easy to do apparently - and block the chimney. This caused the folk inside to stagger out coughing and wheezing, much to the amusement of the miscreants perched on the roof! 'Victory Hut' has always struck me as a very upbeat name for a building commemorating a war that had witnessed such global carnage. Hanney alone saw 29 men never return, whilst 6 were lost in WW2 In contrast to 'Victory Hut', the title 'Hanney War Memorial Hall' seems to me to be a very downbeat name for a place where much jollity is regularly to be had! It reminds me of the dour and dull 1950s. which I can just about recall...rationing didn't end until 1954. I don't propose to compile a list of 'things we didn't have in the 1950s', and anyway the current hall wasn't opened until 24th January 1970 by Lady Page of Hinton Waldrist. I wonder if she'd been a regular at the dances in the Victory Hut? (See the plague on the wall to the right of the main entrance.) For clarity and brevity I usually refer in these pages to the HWMH as the village hall, but some say there be folk who would be sore offended were the hall not to always be given its full and original name. I don't share their view, and in the seven+ years I've been editing this little mag, no one has ever told me, either by letter, email, phone or to my face that they've taken offence at it being called the Village Hall. Whichever is your preference dear readers. and especially you newcomers to our community, please do not allow yourselves to be confused by the names! HWMH and the Village Hall are one and the same!



## THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND



Where do you feel closest to God/most spiritual?

I was asked this recently on a training day led by Rev. Paul Cudby. The responses from our group included; by water, on a mountain top, when alone, on a walk. Usually, Paul told us, people's answers are related to being outside and in nature. There is something about being outdoors that can affect how we think and feel. The Bible tells us that God is everywhere and has created all things; "God created the heavens and stretched them out; he fashioned the earth and all that lives there; he gave life and breath to all its people" Isaiah 42:5.

When asked where people should worship God, Jesus replied that there was not a set location but a right attitude "when the true worshipers will worship the Father in the Spirit and in truth" John 4:23. This can be in a church, on a walk, sitting in a comfy chair, staring at the stars, while at work, when with others or on your own. It is about cultivating an attitude of awareness, being open to God wherever you are. This can happen in any place, but certain places seem to help.

There is a concept called "thin places", locations where people feel more spiritual and most aware of God's presence. This could be in an ancient church building, that has been a place of worship and prayer for hundreds of years or out in the countryside where we are surrounded by the beauty and wonder of God's creation.

My response to where I felt closest to God, was in certain moments. These have been walking on a footpath through fields, alone in a rural church, sitting on a train waiting for it to leave, being in my office at home, when worshiping in a field with hundreds of other Christians or just pausing for a moment during a stressful day. There are certain places that have and do help me feel more aware of God, but I am also working at remembering God is present wherever I am and whatever is going on, I need to be more aware of God's continuous availability.

This week, I hope that you find a space or a moment that helps you be more aware of God. That you will be able to find a time and place where you are fully aware of yourself and of all that is going on within you and around you. To find you own "thin place" whether inside or outdoors, on your own or with others, while active or at rest, where you can be reconnected in mind, body and soul.

I mentioned the Letcombe Brook on page 5 as being the very interesting subject of a recent walk. The brook itself is managed by the Letcombe Brook Project, ably led by a fine gent called Mark Bradfield. They recently published details of what they've done on our stretch, and below is a summary. Big ups to all involved!

"We continue to improve and care for the entire length of the brook for both people and wildlife. We have several ongoing projects, some of which receive funding from the Environment Agency (EA) and Trust for Oxfordshire's Environment. (TOE) For our core funding we rely on the Town, Parish and District Councils; thank you for your continued support.



#### **Hanney Historical** Calendar.

This month's pic was taken in approx. 1910 in East Hanney. The house on the left was the Post Office, which at that time was run by spinster sisters Mary Ann and Margaret Ellen Piggot. They delivered letters, one up the street and one down, and kept bees in a skep - a kind of wicker bee hive. Mary Ann was nicknamed Dr Piggot, because

she could, allegedly, cure anything, and accepted no payment. Remember no NHS back in those days.

She is listed in the UK City and County Directory of 1887 as a dressmaker shopkeeper, as well as the 'receiver' at the Post Office. The entry tells us the letters arrived from Wantage at 7.55am and were dispatched at 6.30pm.

Their brother Edward was a cobbler and he may have run a cobblers business from the property before his sisters took over. Mary Ann was about 76 when this photo was taken, so she's clearly not the young lady in the doorway. Nor is it her sister who was only about three years younger. The young woman may have been the daughter of another East Hanney shop-

keeper called Mrs Gilbert, who we shall meet in August. I have no idea who the three gents are, two in the cart, with the other apparently holding the horse, in the middle of the photo.

Mary, Margaret and brother Edward all died in or around 1911 - 1913, when the Post office



moved to Cross Tree House.

The photo below, taken from almost the same spot, has many folk - I would guess instructed by the photographer - standing in a line across the road. It enlarges quite well, and is a fabulous picture, albeit a bit battered. I will try and include it next year's calendar (2023), which I hope will be available in the Autumn. In this pic, the roof of the post office looks rather sad. I wonder if it was renewed before the current calendar pic was taken? It certainly looks new in the latter.

If you have any ideas on who the four people may be in the calendar photo - or indeed any in the other photo - please let me know. This kind of stuff really floats my canoe!




