





I've news of another bench to tell you about. This one has recently been installed in memory of Adam Cavendish, of West Hanney, who passed away at the tragically young age of 51 in April of last year. He left a young family.

Adam was much loved and inspirational ...note the short but wonderful phrase on the plaque on his bench. It's sited on the meadow that lies between East and West Hanney, on the western edge, and affords a wonderful view towards East Hanney. It is an ideal place for spotting wildlife. Behind it are several very young fruit trees, planted with a view to developing an orchard along that western boundary behind the bench. More trees are to be planted this autumn.



Following last months' piece about Mrs Gilbert and her shop, I received a lovely email from Keith and Jenny Diment, long time residents who recently moved to Wantage.

Many of us, myself included, remember them with much affection. They were absolute stalwarts in our community, not least of course, producing the first Hanney News in December 1975, and continuing to publish and edit it for 25 years! They never missed a single month!

Here's Keith's email....

"Jim, Jenny and I were very interested to read the page about Gilbert's Cottage in the August Hanney News.

Gilbert's Cottage is, of course, immediately opposite Lay Cottage and we well remember the day we hired a white van and moved ourselves and all our belongings from a little terrace house in Oxford into Lay Cottage. It was on 30th June 1962, a hot sunny day, and we were tired out. Mrs Gilbert and Lil Hodgetts called us across the road, took us in, sat us down and gave us cups of tea and cake. Tea and cake had never been so delicious. Mrs Gilbert and Lil were the first of so

many friends we made in Hanney. What a welcome on our very first day, and what a contrast to the impersonal crowds and noise of the city. Before nightfall we knew we had made the right move.

After fifty-one and a half years at Lay Cottage our circumstances had changed enough to make the next move necessary, but we shall always look back with fond memories on more than half a century in friendly Hanney. Regards, Keith"

We were similarly welcomed by our neighbours when we moved into our home in Hanney in 2000. 



Dear Friends

"Are you the new vicar!" is a question I have been asked a couple of times recently. Not in Hanney I hasten to add. I did flatter myself that someone thought I looked "new" and young despite feeling tired and old; but I suspect that is not what was meant.

Language can be confusing and sometimes the same phrase can mean different things or at least we can hear something that was not at all intended to be conveyed.

I have been intrigued by the correspondence in this illustrious publication about sin and forgiveness. Indeed I have been grateful for it has stimulated some interesting conversations. But such terms as 'sin' are religious and need fuller explanation.

Paul tries to explain the good news about Jesus in a variety of ways including being renewed. For instance he uses the language of relationships, of being reconciled or becoming friends with God or being adopted as God's children. He uses the commercial terms of being redeemed or accounted and the legal term of being justified; he talks about manumission and freedom. He is very creative with his use of imagery to teach us that The Lord wants to help and save us. You may not like the idea of being described as being in a position of needing help but there is no doubt that life at the moment has a lot of troubling issues. I applaud those who face the truth and seek a solution, like the local volunteer litter pickers who clean up our country lanes.

If you are in the fortunate position of having all you require then can I encourage you to be thankful but if you are aware of a need or concern may I remind you that The Lord Jesus is always ready to hear, help and renew.

The September photograph in the fantastic Hanney History Calendar - now available for free!! - see page 16 - is of one of the best known buildings in Hanney, 'Dandridge's Mill', with, alongside it, the very picturesque, ivy clad Mill House. Outside its gate stands a gent in a boater, hands in pockets, looking away from camera...clearly a rather shy fellow.

The wording on the front of the Mill itself reads 'Dandridge Bros, Millers, Maltsters, Straw, Hay, Corn and Seed Merchants'. Emerging from the entrance to the Mill is a magnificent horse-drawn cart loaded with two very long ladders and what looks like material for thatching. Perched on the top and seemingly holding the reins of Dobbin the horse - I've just guessed his name - is what looks like quite a young child, probably a boy. I'm guessing this was a posed photo...Dobbin appears to be standing still. A book could - and indeed should - be written about the Mill, but until it is, here's a very brief summary of its fascinating story. Mills have been on the site for centuries, and the current building dates from roughly 1820, when it was a silk mill. Prisoners from the Napoleonic War worked there and were given quite a bit of freedom, certainly enough to charm and court the local ladies at any opportunity!

Tragedy struck on October 1st 1828 when eight year old Thomas Stallwood was crushed to death in the silk mill machinery. The business did not succeed, and at some point - maybe after only 20 years or so - it became a grain mill.

In 1881 the owner was 61 year old Dennis Dandridge who had come from East Hendred some thirty years before. His sons Alfred, Edgar and, later, Dennis Junior, took over running when Dennis Senior retired. The grain, on carts pulled by three carthorses - what a magnificent sight that would have been! - was distributed far and wide, with loads going to Witney, Oxford



and elsewhere. Flour milling ceased in the 1920s, with only animal feed being produced until sometime in the 1930s. During World War Two the mill was used to manufacture parts for Mosquito bombers. Over 24 local folk worked there. It was also used to store valuable furniture that had been removed from London, I. wonder who owned the furniture? At this time the mill was owned by Mr and Mrs de la Gough. They lived in the Mill House and allegedly, Mrs de la Gough's habit of nude sunbathing in her garden provided welcome lunchtime entertainment for the workers who ascended to the mill roof to get a good view! At some point after the War, a Mrs de

Winter owned the Mill and the House, and turned the latter into a country club. A regular visitor was Rev TB Cooke, vicar of West Hanney, who also frequented the Plough.

Another change of use happened in the 1960s when it became the home and studio of "Pud" Farmer, a sculptor – or "construction artist" as he preferred to be known. Allegedly, several of his works exist locally. Please let me know if you're an owner of one...I'd love to see it. After falling derelict, the mill found a new owner who converted it into accommodation, with the stream now put to a different use...it powers a reverse Archimedean screw no less, that provides all the electricity this wonderful and historic building currently (geddit?) uses.



GARD is a local community group formed to campaign against Thames Water's proposals to build a reservoir south-west of Abingdon.

Abingdon reservoir - not a solution during drought

The recent dry spell has highlighted the need for effective water resource management, but the proposed Abingdon reservoir would not provide resilience during drought conditions.

Covering over 4sq miles of land, up to 30m in height above ground and holding 150 billion litres of water it would take 10 years to build and a further 2 years to fill from the Thames.

The alternative Severn to Thames transfer

scheme could be up and running in 3 years and would bring new water into the area.

Past records show, that in a drought like 1976, it would have been impossible to fill the Abingdon reservoir from the loca Thames for over 18 months.

What the drought does highlight is that Thames Water, who leak more water in a day (600 million litres) than any other UK water company, need to urgently deal with this problem - where a solution could be delivered years before the construction of anv reservoir.


