




time, but still no result. Another penalty shoot out, and again we came through the winners! These children work so hard and are really coming together as a team. What's more, they're really having fun and that's what's

The 'Letcombe Brook Project' - the fab and groovy folk who look after our precious Letcombe Brook, recently visited the Wantage Sewage Treatment Works. It was 'quite the eye opener'...their words. One clear message from it was "please don't flush wet wipes and similar products down the loo, even if they say they are flushable on the packet!' This is a real problem, cos though they flush ok, they don't actually break down, and hence - not an easy job! - it goes to 'landfill' anyway, so probably best to just put it in your bin in the first place.

At present, the sewage works releases untreated sewage into the Brook when they can't deal with the volume, after heavy rain etc. The good news is that they released less than half the 2020 total in 2021, but it's still way more than we want going into our beautiful chalkstream, so let's all try and do our bit!

When a reservoir in our area was first put forward, opinions within the Council were divided. Individually, we had our own image of what a reservoir would look like and how it would protect our area from potential water shortages brought about by climate change.

Through GARD, however, we have been shown the reality... the huge environmental destruction, with many unanswered questions surrounding existing water courses and the increased flood risk. Unusually, there is now full agreement in opposition to this scheme, from every Parish Council through to District and County Council. This is without doubt thanks to GARD's relentless questioning, technical expertise and their continual holding of Thames Water to account. The main beneficiaries of this scheme appear to be the shareholders of Thames Water. If it was their customers, then other schemes which are cheaper, less disruptive, less environmentally damaging and quicker to implement would have been preferred.

Regrettably, the selling of water to other areas seems to be the driver.

We as a Parish Council, however, are here to represent the views of all parishioners, and we understand there are those that support the reservoir proposal. GARD are our technical representatives, and it is their information that forms our current view, but that does not mean that we are a closed book, and we are always happy to hear the representations of parishioners. *Steve McKechnie - Chairman*



This is the latest from GARD...

"The next phase of the consultation on the mega-Reservoir is now open. This is the Water Resources South-East Regional draft plan, and we expect the Thames Water part of this plan to have opened on 14th December. From the WRSE plan we can see your response last time has had an impact and slightly changed the plan, but a 100 billion litre reservoir is still firmly proposed up front. This is still huge, and it is not the safest, cheapest, most drought resilient option to provide water (none of which is intended for Oxfordshire).

We are convinced that this proposal can be defeated, especially as we have the support of County and District, and many Parishes. It is however even more important that we have a large number of responses to this stage of the consultation.

None have appeared - thus far anyway - in Hanney News, as far as I can remember, simply because I have not been sent any! Please see East Hanney Parish Council's contribution on page 6.

Here's the Jan 2023

photo from our History calendar...if you haven't got yours yet, see page 14. It's of the magnificent Grade II listed 'West Hanney House' that many of us will be familiar with, though may-

be not this view, since it was taken from the garden on the south side.

John Betjamin described it as 'A Vanbrugh influenced, symmetrical Georgian house of remarkable distinction'. John Vanbrugh was a British architect, born in 1664, who designed Blenheim Palace amongst many other buildings. (He was also a controversial playwright who got into trouble because of his very risqué dramas!) The original building that stood on the site of Hanney House was owned by the Diocese of Salisbury and was so dilapidated at the time of the death, in 1718, of its tenant Elizabeth Bowles, that the house had to be rebuilt. Now our Liz was herself a bit of a local celeb... allegedly aged 124 when she died (!) - there's a plaque to her on the wall in St James Church - she was said to be the oldest woman who ever lived in the UK. (I'll explain why I take that claim with a massive pinch of salt next month.) When she got married, her husband brought her to Hanney in a cart pulled by a team of 12 snow-white oxen....pass the salt pot again please! (I brought my bride home in our Austin Allegro. Still got the bride - 40 years later! - but the Allegro - an ex-police car that had been well 'used' by our boys in blue before I bought it - went for scrap!) Back to the house ... its rebuild happened in the early 1720s, and it became part of a select group of local grand houses, including Kingston Bagpuize House and Ardington House that had been built by a local school of Vanbrugh-influenced masons. Experts claim that the curves of West Hanney House are reminiscent of Italian



Baroque precedents, where 'curve and counter curve create a sense of frozen drama' as in the undulating, restless walls of San Carlo, a church and monastery built in Rome by Francesco Borromini, an Italian architect, who died in 1667.

I wonder if the estate agents mentioned that in their sales material when West Hanney House recently came on the market? It's set in the centre of a walled 2.87 acre garden, with high gates and an imposing facade. If you look carefully at the side of the building that's in shadow in our photo the elevation that faces West Hanney Village Green - you can see that some of the windows are in fact false.

On all the real windows in the photo you will see some large crisscross white material...tape perhaps?...its purpose unknown, though some have suggested it was maybe to prevent the shattering of the glass which would have been very thin - were bombs to have fallen nearby during World War Two. None did fall on Hanney, though it was a potential target area, as by 1943 it was surrounded by four airfields within a 5 mile radius. Our fab History Group have produced some great info on Hanney in WW2...really interesting stuff, and well worth checking out on their website: hanneyhistory.org.uk

The house, along with approx. 92 acres of agricultural land, was sold by the Diocese on 4th Aug 1887 to a man named John Thomas Jackson. During the First World War it was owned by a Mr Craddock who sold off the farmland, some to the wellknown local builder JP Barrett. The most recent owners, the Tyser family, have only recently sold, and we at Global HQ wish the new residents a long and happy stay in what is surely one of the finest properties in Hanney.
